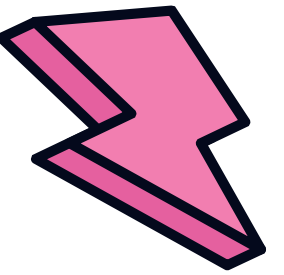


# Puzzle Mystery



# Puzzle Mystery



We all love to read stories that create suspense and drama, questioning the reader to find the answers. Well that's what today's puzzle mystery is all about. You will need to split students into teams of 4 to 5 students, depending on your class size. The game requires teams to be no larger than five players per team.

Each team needs to solve the eight questions that all link together; once a question is answered correctly they receive 1 piece of the puzzle. Completing all eight questions, students solve the puzzle giving them the secret code to exit the classroom. The final mission is finding Dale's hiding spot. Students can use devices or resources needed to complete the questions correctly. Each team receives a question card; print before the game commences with the puzzle pieces.

Before starting the game, set the scene by reading the following story-

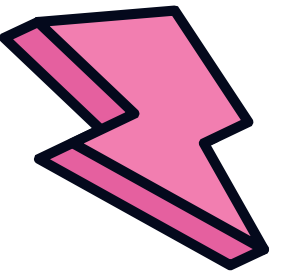
A new student by the name of Dale Carlos (or create a name you would prefer) has just arrived at school for his first day. Dale is a very shy and timid boy; his mother says a teary goodbye, quickly leaving the classroom. Dale looks around at his fellow class mates feeling overwhelmed and anxious, before the teacher can reassure him, Dale bolts out the door.

The teacher knows Dale is hiding somewhere in the school grounds. To solve this mystery, students must work as a team answering the following 8 questions correctly and receiving 1 puzzle piece per question. Once completed the secret code will be revealed.

Puzzle Questions	Answers for teacher
Dale started his journey from Melbourne Australia; he then flew to Auckland, reaching his destination in Hong Kong. Add the total distance to the nearest kilometre that Dale travelled on his journey?	11,769 Kilometres
While visiting these three countries Dale learnt some new words and sayings. Can you please describe the meaning of each word or what the slang sentence means? <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. I'm flat out like a lizard drinking?</li><li>2. Hey bro, I have bugger all money eh?</li><li>3. Sik jor fahn mei ah?</li></ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Means that you are extremely busy.</li><li>2. This means that I don't have very much money</li><li>3. Have you eaten yet? Or How are you?</li></ol>

<p>Using the total number of kilometres Dale flew during the first three flights, subtract 11,719 from this number then complete this many bear crawls?</p> <p>This task requires team members to complete an even number of bear crawls. For example- If the final number was 25, and you had 5 team members, each member would complete 5 lengths of bear crawls to claim the puzzle piece.</p>	<p>Answer is 50 (set up a 5 or 10 metre distance that they have to complete the bear crawls between)</p>
<p>This is a random fun component. Teams must complete the following three structures. Each structure is progressively harder. This is an honesty task, so when teams feel they have completed each of the structures to an acceptable standard; they collect puzzle piece number five.</p>	<p>Complete the three holds in a safe fashion. It's a good idea to have grass or a soft surface in case they fall</p>

<p>Now that you are a tight knit group, with a great name and great jingle. You must create a special team hand shake; complete the handshake with group members. Creativity is the key to receiving puzzle piece seven.</p>	<p>Each teams will be different and unique.</p>

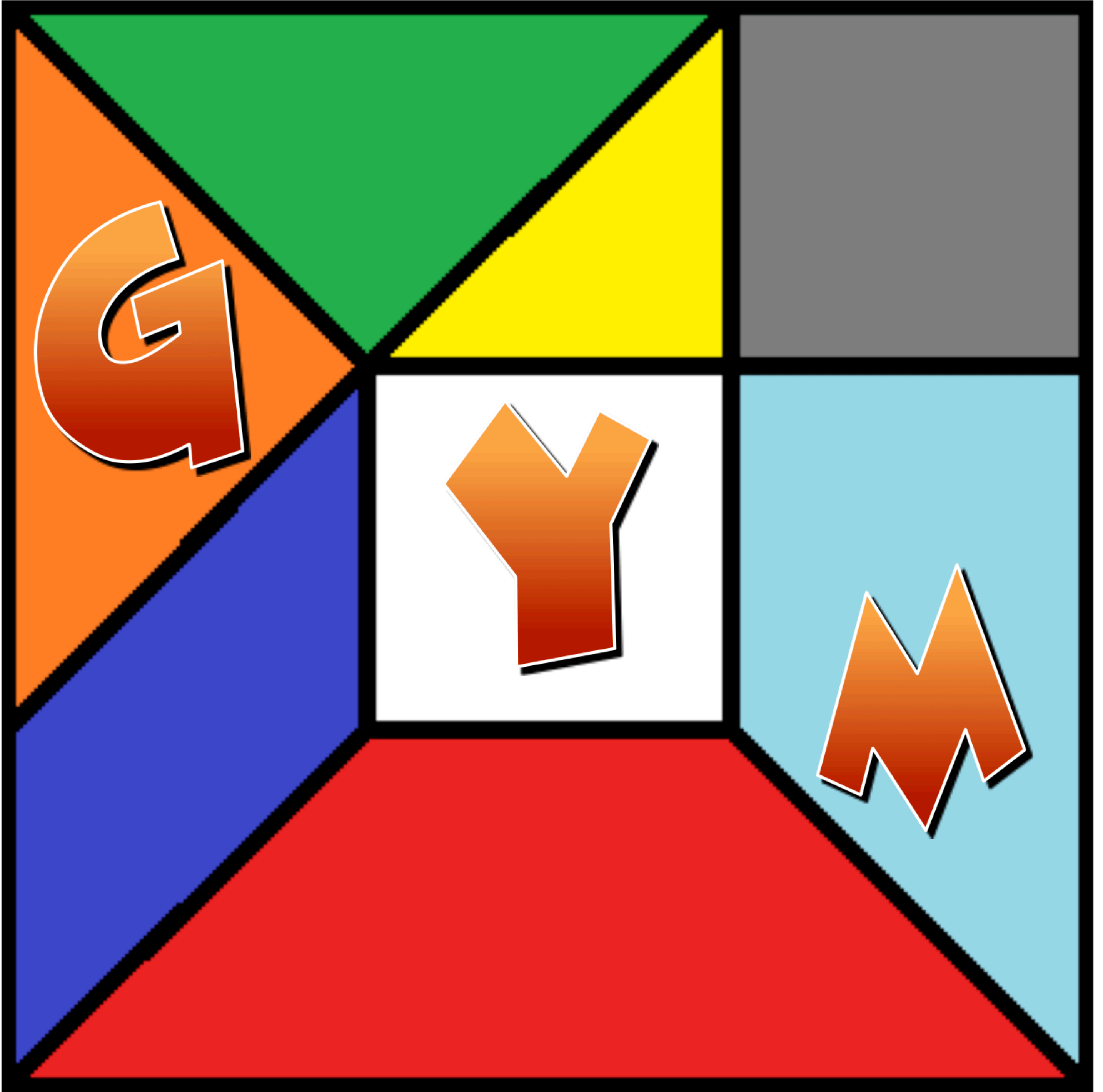

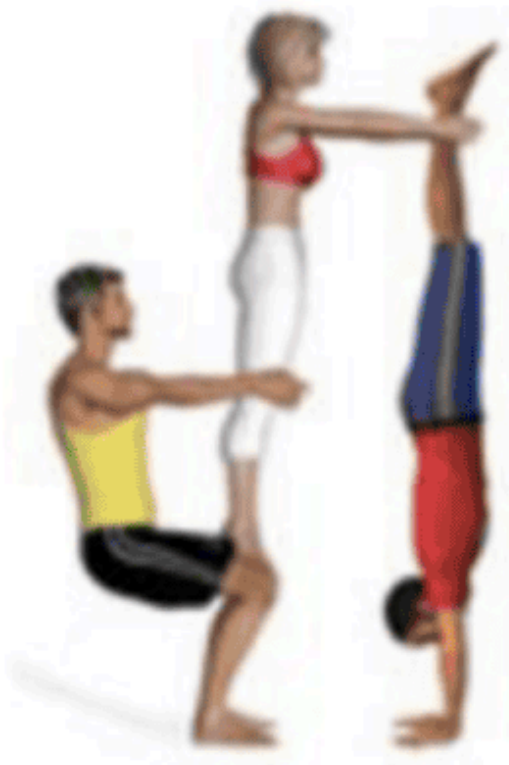

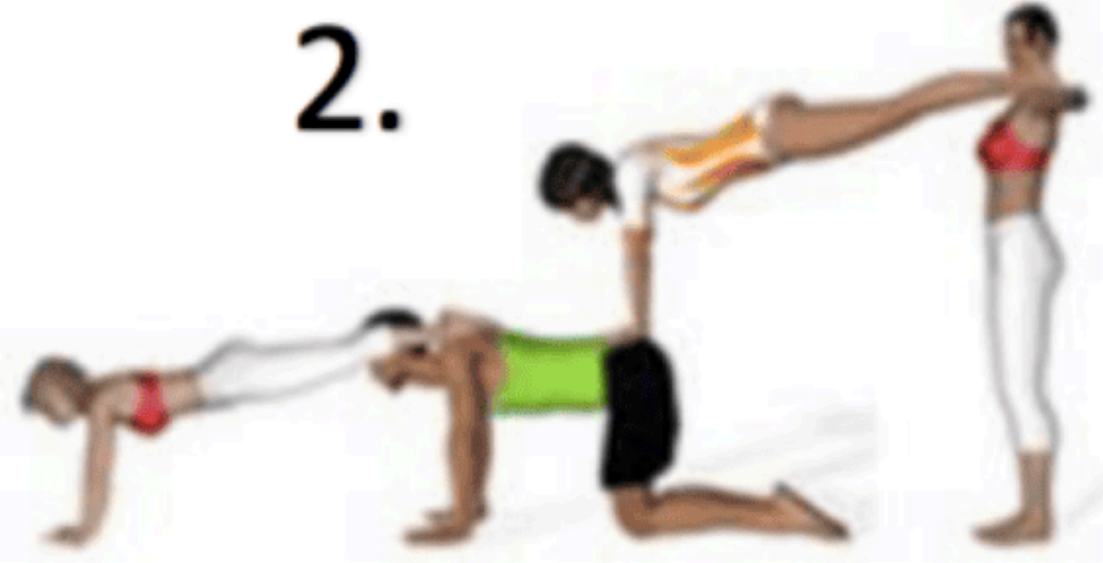
