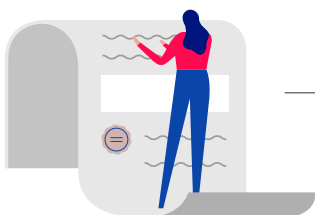

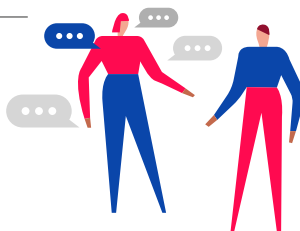

ARCHITECTURE**

Introduction

Architecture is a multidisciplinary profession requiring a combination of artistic, technological and social expertise. Architects must understand the needs of people who will use their buildings and the technology available to meet these needs. They attempt to create something that is both functional and a work of art. The challenge of Architecture is to produce within a given budget, an aesthetically-pleasing design which will stand up to wear and tear, and is the kind of building in which people want to live or work in.



Course Organisation

Architecture is a two-tier scheme of study, the first part (undergraduate level) gives accreditation to the ARB/RIBA Part 1, and the second tier (postgraduate) gives exemption to the ARB/RIBA Part 2. Practical work experience is required to be a full-fledged architect.

Course Content

There are a number of options and it depends on your academic and creative strengths. Some universities focus on the structural aspects which requires students to have background in Mathematics and Physics. Other universities focus more on the creative side and therefore prefer students with Arts as a subject at A Levels. There are also universities which place importance on the historical aspects of architecture in which students with History at A levels will have an added advantage.

The development of design skills through projects is central to an Architecture course.

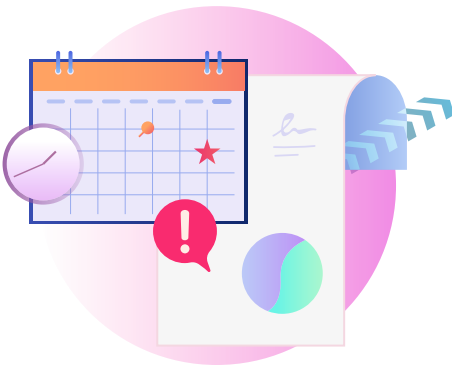


APPLYING FOR ARCHITECTURE

How it works

Applications for undergraduate degrees for most of the UK universities go via UCAS. You will need to register and complete the UCAS form, with payment, by the set deadline. Colleges will usually set internal deadlines for their students. With the exception of Cambridge, the UCAS deadline for competitive universities is January 14, 2026.

The final deadline to submit a UCAS application is June 30.

Entry Requirements

Universities in general prefer a combination of Science or Maths, and Humanities or Art subjects at A Levels. A good portfolio can usually replace Art at A Levels.

Non-Academic Requirements

Most universities will request for a portfolio from applicants before a decision is made. Portfolio will showcase students' creative work such as freehand drawings, three dimensional work, short appraisal of a building visited, and more. For international students, photographs or reduced photocopies of work may be acceptable, but should be authenticated prior to their submission to the universities.

For students with outstanding portfolios, a lower grade offer may be made.

*Please refer to the universities' websites to check the required format for the portfolio.

Selectors' Attitude

You must show awareness of the relationship between people and the built environment. Your UCAS application is always considered as a whole; taking into account your qualifications, experience, personal statement and reference.

Personal Statement

You need to show that you have a practical as well as creative mind, an interest in people and their changing lifestyles, self-confidence to put over new ideas, mathematical ability, drawing skills, and more. You need to outline relevant work experience or exposure to show that you have a clear understanding of the profession and your awareness of the demand of the course.

UCAS has implemented a system called the UCAS Similarity Detection Service to verify the authenticity of Personal Statements. If significant amounts of similarities are detected and the Verification staff decides to flag a personal statement, the university and the applicant will be notified via email by UCAS.

LOOKING AHEAD

Career Path

In order to practice or carry on business under any title that includes the word 'Architect' in Malaysia, a person must fulfil several academic and professional requirements, including as follows:

- Architecture graduates from accredited programmes are eligible to register with the Board of Architects Malaysia i.e. Lembaga Arkitek Malaysia (LAM) as an architectural graduate.
- You need to pass the Malaysian professional practice examination, Part III, as set jointly by the Pertubuhan Arkitek Malaysia (PAM) and Lembaga Arkitek Malaysia (LAM).
- You need to have 2 years of practical working experience and one of these years must be obtained in Malaysia in an architect's practise which is registered with LAM.

The Architects Registration Board (ARB) is the statutory body which regulates the architectural profession in the UK.

The Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) is the professional body for Architects in the UK. To practise as an architect, your qualifications will need to be validated and reviewed by ARB and RIBA.

You will then have to undertake a Part 3 qualification once you have met the required criteria.

Not everyone who completes an Architecture degree wants to practise as an Architect. Other career options are:
