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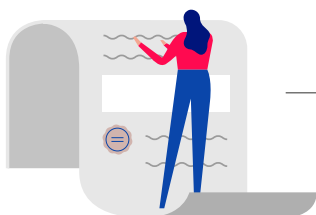

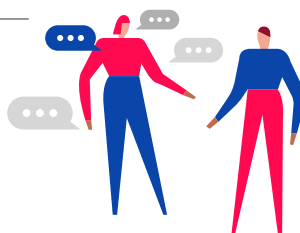

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GET TO KNOW MATHEMATICS

Introduction

Mathematics at degree level has two related but different areas – Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics. This is demonstrated in something we all know well - Pythagoras's Theorem. The use of Pythagoras in calculating the length of sides of a triangle is Applied Mathematics, at a simple level. The proof of Pythagoras's Theorem is Pure Mathematics.

There is a lot of interaction between the two; Pure Maths develops methods that can be used in Applied Maths, while Applied Maths raises problems which lead to the study and research in whole areas of Pure Maths.

Pure Maths can include calculus, analysis (concept of limits, continuity), algebra (complex numbers, vectors, matrices, modular arithmetic, permutations, group theory), coordinate and vector geometry, as well as computer algebra.

Applied Maths can include everything mentioned above, and also applied to optimisation, game theory, modelling and physical maths such as mechanics, Newtonian dynamics, statistics, probability, as well as financial engineering, computer programming, internet security.

Maths these days is seen as a degree subject which gives a modern base of knowledge and skills for many other subjects.



Course Organisation

The BSc Mathematics course is a 3-year degree, and the MMath course is 4 years in duration.

The 4-year MMath course offers you the opportunity to delve more deeply into pure and applied mathematics than is possible on a BSc course. The MMath course is an ideal preparation if you want to go on to work in research or for a technological company or simply want to gain a deeper understanding of mathematics and develop skills in demand by a range of prospective employers.

Course Content

Example course modules covered in the degree are calculus, algebra, probability, differential equations, algorithms and applications, and problem solving methods.

Students will be assessed through a combination of coursework and examinations.



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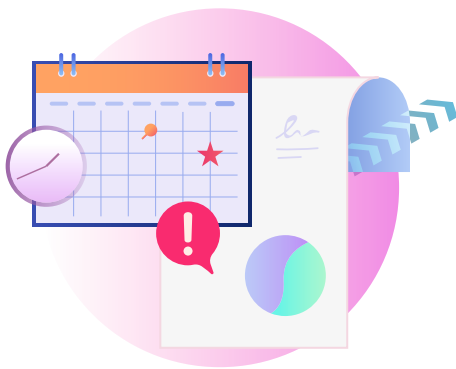
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APPLYING FOR MATHEMATICS

How it works

Applications for undergraduate degrees for most of the UK universities go via UCAS. You will need to register and complete the UCAS form, with payment, by the set deadline. Colleges will usually set internal deadlines for their students. With the exception of Oxford and Cambridge, the UCAS deadline for competitive universities is January 13, 2027

The final deadline of UCAS application is June 30.

Difference between Maths and Applied Maths

Maths is the study of topic like quantity (number theory), structure (algebra), space (geometry) and change (mathematical analysis)

Entry Requirements

Three A-level subjects which include Mathematics at A level or IB Higher level. A-level Further Mathematics is highly desirable for some universities. Admissions tests such as STEP or MAT tests are essential for some competitive universities. General papers and Critical Thinking are not accepted.

Selectors' Attitude

Your UCAS application is always considered as a whole; taking into account your qualifications, experience, personal statement and reference.

Some universities will ask for STEP/MAT tests, and the result can determine the outcome of your application.

Personal Statement

Candidates need to demonstrate their motivation and enthusiasm for the subject. For example, additional reading on Mathematics books beyond the A-level/IB syllabus are encouraged. Participation in Mathematical competitions in national, international or any activities related to Maths would be an added advantage.

UCAS has implemented a system called the UCAS Similarity Detection Service to verify the authenticity of Personal Statements. If significant amounts of similarities are detected and the Verification staff decides to flag a personal statement, the university and the applicant will be notified via email by UCAS.
