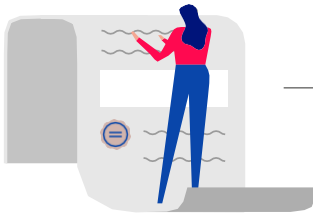

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GET TO KNOW COMPUTER SCIENCE

Introduction

Most people go through their day by using some form of computer device or another. A computer is a programmable digital electronic device for performing mathematical or logical operations - so this includes your phones, tablets or any other device that qualifies with this definition. The make-up of a computer is simple - it's hardware and software. Hardware is run by electronic components whilst software is run by special codes called programs.

Computer Science is the study of computers and computational systems. Unlike electrical and computer engineers, computer scientists deal mostly with software and software systems; this includes their theory, design, development, and application. It also concerns the practical techniques of programming computers to solve real and difficult problems, and there are many links to other subjects such as electronics, physics, mathematics, biology, psychology, linguistics, and even sociology.

The British Computer Society (BCS) – The Chartered Institute of IT is responsible for the regulation of ICT and computer science fields within the UK.

The BCS is the only professional body in the United Kingdom with the ability to grant chartered status to IT, thus having the ability to grant Chartered (Professional) status to both its Fellows and Professional members. Chartered IT Professionals are entitled to use the suffix CITP.



Course Organisation

Courses are available as either 3 years full time BSc degrees (4 years in Scotland), or 4 years undergraduate Masters MSci degree (5 years in Scotland). The undergraduate Masters degree's fourth year is devoted to developing and honing research skills chiefly through an extended research project focusing on research done within the research groups in the school or faculty.

Students can opt for an additional year of placement, which takes place in the 2nd last year of study. Some universities also offer courses that are accredited by the Engineering council. Therefore, they graduate with either a BEng or MEng similar to other Engineering Disciplines.

Students are taught through a combination of lectures, tutorials and practical classes. In later years, students spend more time working on projects that involve building computer systems from scratch, developing systems, doing experimental work or working on more theoretical topics with guidance from their supervisors.

Assessment is by coursework assignments, larger projects and exams. Some project work will be undertaken individually and some together with other students. Students will complete a large individual project in their final year of study.



Course Content

The term Computer Science (CS) is often used as an umbrella term to cover various specialist and vocational degrees involving computers and technology. Sometimes it can also be used to refer to information technology (IT) degrees. It is therefore important to check your chosen university's course details carefully.

All computer science degrees will build up your foundation by teaching core concepts of computing like mathematics, logic and engineering. Examples of these core modules may include theory of computation, fundamentals of computer science, compilers and operating systems, information theory, basic programming, systems and architecture, software development and testing, web applications and databases, algorithms and data structures, and principles of computer hardware. Mathematical concepts covered include formal methods, Boolean algebra, discrete mathematics, set theory, probability, statistics, linear algebra, differential equations and calculus.

Specialist computer science topics are ever-growing and ever-changing. This includes advanced internet, advanced programming, artificial intelligence and artificial life, computational logic, computer graphics, computer modelling, computer networks, computer security, computer vision, encryption, ethical hacking, graphics user interface (GUIs), games development, human-computer interaction, mobile applications, multimedia computing, networking theory, professional issues and research methods, software engineering and design, and web-development.

Many other combinations of courses are available apart from straightforward computer science courses. Other popular courses include artificial intelligence, information systems, software engineering, health informatics, etc.

Entry requirements for computer science degrees usually emphasises mathematics. Students are not usually expected to have formally studied computer science before university. However, it is recommended that students pick up a programming language, to gain an understanding of what is involved. Generally accepted beginner languages include Python and C++, Haskell, Java and Pascal.

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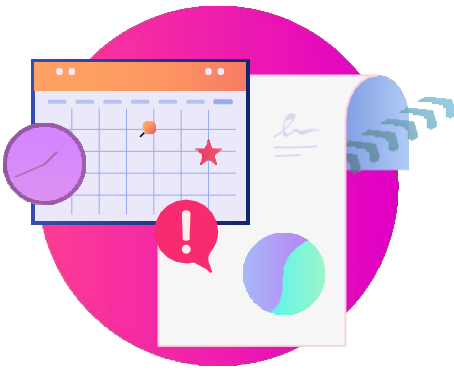


APPLYING FOR COMPUTER SCIENCE

How it works

Applications for undergraduate degrees for most of the UK universities go via UCAS. You will need to register and complete the UCAS form, with payment, by the set deadline. Colleges will usually set internal deadlines for their students. With the exception of Oxford and Cambridge, the UCAS deadline for competitive universities is January 14, 2026

The final deadline of UCAS application is June 30.
