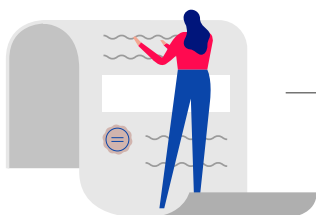

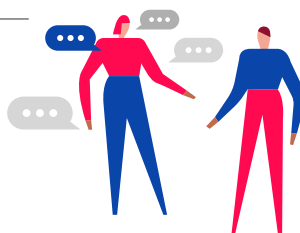

GET TO KNOW ECONOMICS

Introduction

Economics is a social science that studies the production, distribution and consumption of goods and services in human society. It studies how human beings use resources at a local individual level, at national levels and in international interactions.

There are many specialised areas of economic activity, and subsequently many specialised areas of economic studies.



Course Organisation

Typically, an Economics degree lasts 3 years. Students can opt for an additional year of placement or study abroad, which takes place in the third year of study.

Modules are taught through lectures, small group tutorials and seminars.

Assessments will depend on the modules, with compulsory subjects typically being assessed in examinations, supplemented by written essays and elective modules by a combination of these and other exercises.

Course Content

The degree will be mathematically rigorous, and students should have an aptitude for and enjoyment of mathematics, along with strong analytical ability.

First Year

Students will study for the essential foundation in Economics and the necessary mathematical skills. Subjects will normally include Introductory Economics, Mathematics, Statistics and a wider Social Sciences elective.

Second Year

Students will build their theoretical foundation in Economics to a higher level and study the empirical research methods in Economics. They will also learn to apply theories to analyse economic problems. Subjects will normally include Intermediate Microeconomics, Intermediate Macroeconomics, Introductory Econometrics, and Advanced Mathematical Methods.

Third Year

Students will study advanced level subjects in all the main fields of economics. Students can select subjects according to their interests. These include Financial Economics, International Economics, Public Economics, Industrial Economics, and more.

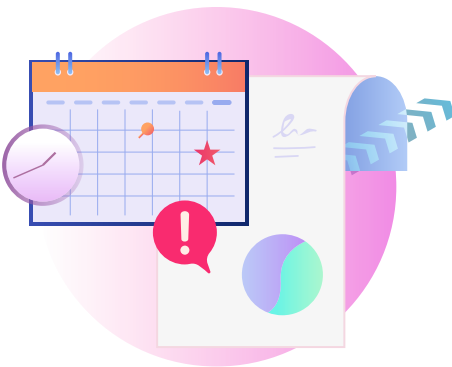


APPLYING FOR ECONOMICS

How it works

Applications for undergraduate degrees for most of the UK universities go via UCAS. You will need to register and complete the UCAS form, with payment, by the set deadline. Schools and colleges will usually set internal deadlines for their students. With the exception of Oxford and Cambridge, the UCAS deadline for competitive universities is January 13, 2027.

The final deadline to submit a UCAS application is June 30.

Entry Requirements

Universities are happy to accept 3 A-Level subjects or a combination of 3 HL and 3 SL IB subjects from Arts, Humanities, Maths and Sciences. Many competitive universities will require Maths as one of the A Levels or IB subjects. General Studies and Critical Thinking are not accepted.

Selectors' Attitude

Your UCAS application is always considered as a whole; taking into account your qualifications, personal statement and reference.

Some universities will look for clear mathematical aptitude and capability in your application.

Personal Statement

Students are expected to demonstrate interest in analysing real and diverse economic issues with social science approaches. Aptitude for mathematics is essential, particularly to some competitive universities. The ability to construct and defend arguments, as well as communicating them effectively is very crucial.

UCAS has implemented a system called the UCAS Similarity Detection Service to verify the authenticity of Personal Statements. If significant amounts of similarities are detected and the Verification staff decides to flag a personal statement, the university and the applicant will be notified via email by **UCAS**

A day in the life of an Economics student

Student will study the economic theories via the lectures. Further reading is to follow before preparing for the discussion on hypothetical economic problems in the tutorials. The quantitative subjects are mainly for learning mathematical skills to construct mathematical modelling. The mode of learning is quite similar in every subject. Students will also spend time writing essays and dissertation to be submitted by the end of the semester in addition to preparing for exams.

Career Path

Graduates of an Economics degree enjoy a wide variety of career opportunities. They can go on to become analysts in finance, investment, risk, or start a career in business, management, or research. To be an economist, graduates usually will have to further their studies to Master's or Doctorate level so that their theoretical foundation and quantitative capabilities are trained to a level that enables them to handle more complex economic problems.

Examples of graduates' job roles include: Economist Trainee, Market Analyst, Business Reporter, HR Coordinator, Management Trainee, Policy Researcher, and more.
