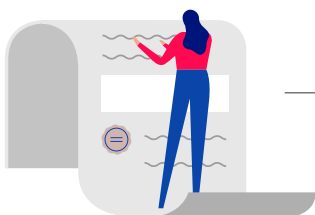

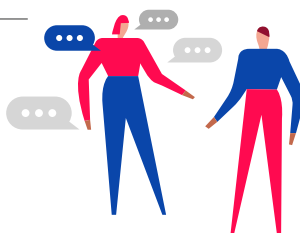

GET TO KNOW PSYCHOLOGY

Introduction

Psychology is the scientific study of Human & Animal Behaviour. It includes a wide range of subjects, all of which are concerned with how organisms, human and animal, interpret and respond to the world around them. Psychology is about *perception* and how we use the information we gather in learning and in memory, how we acquire, store and retrieve information, and is about social behaviour including communication.



Course Organisation

Typically, the degree lasts 3 years. Students can opt for an additional year of placement or study abroad, which takes place in the third year of study. On top of this, there is also an option of taking advanced degree via MSci – this is a 4-year undergraduate degree programme.

Teaching approaches vary from one university to another, generally students are taught through lectures, seminars, workshops, practical sessions and tutorials.

Assessments are conducted via examinations; oral and written assessments; group and individual projects; as well as a dissertation.

Course Content

This list indicates the *uniformity* between most psychology degrees, particularly in the first two years. Furthermore, in the final year, most degrees put considerable emphasis on Project Work.

Some universities put more emphasis on Human aspects of Psychology, including Ageing & Health, and have a hands-on approach in their final year.

- Cognitive Psychology (CP): The study of thought processes, languages, memory and reasoning.
- Developmental Psychology (DP): Sometimes described as ageing, this is how psychological processes change as children and animals grow up.
- Economic Psychology (EP): How people make decisions about economic matters, including shopping, etc.
- Physiological Psychology (PP): Study of the structure of the brain and the nervous system – and their connection to psychological processes.
- Psychometrics (Pm): The measurement and study of the psychological differences between one individual and another, including intelligence, neuroticism, etc.
- Social Psychology (SP): Study of the way humans behave in social groups, and how attitudes are effected by our personal group and culture.
- Abnormal Psychology (AP): The study of mental illness, or deviations from normal behaviour.
- Forensic Psychology (FP) is the joining of Psychology and the Criminal Justice system, which might include sentencing recommendations, future treatment, future risk, etc.

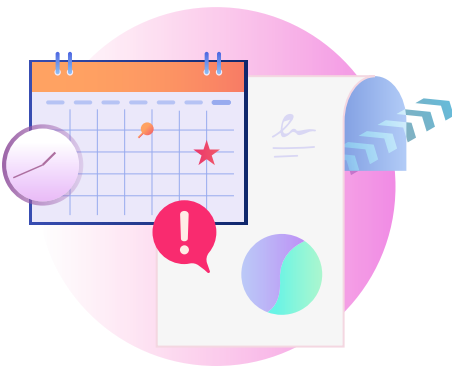


APPLYING FOR PSYCHOLOGY

How it works

Applications for undergraduate degrees for most of the UK universities go via UCAS. You will need to register and complete the UCAS form, with payment, by the set deadline. Colleges will usually set internal deadlines for their students. With the exception of Oxford and Cambridge, the UCAS deadline for competitive universities is January 13, 2027.

The final deadline to submit a UCAS application is June 30.

Entry Requirements

Universities will generally ask for 3 A Levels subjects, with 1 or 2 of them being Science/Mathematics. Psychology at A Levels is not compulsory.

Selectors' Attitude

All aspects of information presented in the UCAS form will be looked at, including predicted academic performance.

Personal Statement

The universities look for someone who is intellectually curious and open-minded. The Personal Statement should reflect student's enthusiasm to study the subject as well as understanding of the scientific underpinning of the discipline.

UCAS has implemented a system called the UCAS Similarity Detection Service to verify the authenticity of Personal Statements. If significant amounts of similarities are detected and the Verification staff decides to flag a personal statement, the university and the applicant will be notified via email by UCAS.

Psychology in Malaysia

In Malaysia, psychology as a profession is neither regulated through legislation, nor is it a self-regulated profession by any professional body. The Malaysian Psychological Association (PSIMA) accepts members who are professionals and non-professionals alike. As Psychology is not a regulated profession in Malaysia, one cannot be “licensed” as a psychologist in Malaysia.

Route to becoming a Psychologist in the UK

The Health Professions Council (HPC-UK) is the statutory regulator for practitioner psychologists in the UK. In the UK, the use of the title "chartered psychologist" is also protected by statutory regulation. The title "chartered psychologist" simply means that the psychologist is a chartered member of the British Psychological Society but it does not necessarily signify the psychologist is registered with the HPC-UK. The threshold level of qualification for entry to the Register for clinical, counselling and educational psychologists is a professional doctorate.
