In fourth grade, when I first received my ¾ size violin, I realized I wanted to pursue a career in music education. I am passionate about the violin and have had the privilege of studying under remarkable musicians growing up in Chicago. Forrest R. Etling was my first instructor when I began my musical journey. I was also a member of the Elgin Youth Symphony, where I was influenced by Margaret Hillis, conductor of the Chicago Symphony Chorus. It was during this time that I developed a love for conducting.

For my degree, I initially attended The Ohio State University, studying with Michael Davis, concertmaster of the Columbus Symphony, and Robert Gillespie, through the Essential Elements program.
