# **TEAM NOTES**

- The **Toronto Raptors** tip off the 2025-26 preseason action Monday evening against the Denver Nuggets. As part of the NBA Canada Series, the game will take place at Rogers Arena in Vancouver, British Columbia. This marks Toronto's seventh preseason game in Vancouver, and first since 2023. Toronto owns a perfect 6-0 record playing in Vancouver.
- The Raptors finished last season at 30-52 (.366), including 18-23 at home and 12-29 on the road. It was the second time in the last 14 years where Toronto finished with a home record below .500.
- In their 30th season, the Raptors set franchise records including a single-game record for total rebounds with 73 boards on Mar. 10 vs. Washington. The Raptors finished with 3,700 total rebounds on the season which is third-most in franchise history. The Raptors also broke the single-season franchise record in total assists on the last game of the season. Toronto finished with 2,340 assists surpassing the previous franchise record of 2,335 that was set last year.
- Toronto acquired Brandon Ingram from New Orleans on Feb. 6 and signed a contract extension on Feb. 12. Ingram joined the Raptors following six seasons in New Orleans where he averaged 23.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 5.2 assists and shot .472 from the field, including .372 (560-1506) from threepoint range. He averaged more than 20.0 points in all six seasons and was named an NBA All-Star in 2020. Ingram also captured the NBA's Most Improved Player Award that same season.
- The Raptors selected forward Collin Murray-Boyles with the ninth overall pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft and Alijah Martin with the 39th overall back in the second round. Toronto signed Murray-Boyles to a rookie scale contract on Jul. 1 while Martin signed a two-way contract with the team on Jul. 10

- Averaged career-high 5.4 assists last year; Has averaged 6+ rebounds and 20+ points in consecutive seasons.
- Became the second-youngest Canadian to reach the 7,000 career point milestone.
- Was one of four in the Eastern Conference and one of eight in the NBA to average 20/6/5 last season.

#### C - JAKOB POELTL #19 MIN: 29.6 REB: 9.6 AST: 2.8 STL: 1.16 TO: 1.9 BLK: 1.25 PTS: 14.5

- Averaged career highs of 14.5 points, 9.6 rebounds, 1.2 steals and 29.6 minutes this season.
- Ranked fifth overall in the NBA in field goal % (.627) last season; Eighth straight season shooting at least .600.
- Finished as only one of two players in the league to shoot 60%+ from the field and record 60+ steals.

#### **G** - **SCOTTIE BARNES** #4 MIN: 32.8 REB: 7.7 AST: 5.8 STL: 1.43 TO: 2.8 BLK: 0.97 PTS: 19.3

- Only player in the NBA to finish with 500+ rebounds, 300+ assists, 90+ steals and 60+ blocks in 2024-25.
- Became the fastest player in franchise history to reach 2,000+ rebounds and 1,000+ assists (267 games).
- Set single-season bests in double-doubles (26) total points scored (1,252) and in total assists dished (378).

#### G-IMMANUEL QUICKLEY #5 MIN: 27.8 REB: 3.5 AST: 5.8 STL: 0.70 TO: 1.8 BLK: 0.12 PTS: 17.1

- · Averaging career highs of 17.9 points, 6.3 assists and 30.7 minutes in 71 career games with Toronto.
- Recorded 191 assists last season marking the most through first 33 games of a season in career.
- · Missed 39 games last year including 22 contests due to a partial UCL tear in the left elbow.

**TORONTO** — RJ Barrett had 22 points and 10 rebounds, and the Toronto Raptors snapped a 10-game losing streak against Boston with a 110-97 victory over the Celtics on Wednesday night ... Jakob Poeltl added 16 points and 11 rebounds as the Raptors won consecutive games for the third time ... Scottie Barnes scored 18 points ... Toronto, which beat Golden State on Monday, has yet to win three straight this season ... Peyton Pritchard scored 20 points, Kristaps Porzingis had 18 and Jayson Tatum added 16 for Boston ... The Celtics shot 16 for 46 from 3-point range ... It was Boston's first loss to Toronto since March 28, 2022 ... Toronto's third win in 19 games was a major turnaround from the Raptors' previous meeting with the Celtics ... Toronto lost by a franchise-worst 54 points, 125-71, on Dec. 31 at Boston ... Raptors guard Immanuel Quickley sat for the second straight game ... He has a left hip injury ... Guard Ochai Agbaji needed three stitches to close a cut on his right hand after being injured in the second quarter ... He did not return ... Jamal Shead's 3 with 7:36 to play capped a 12-4 Toronto run to start the fourth quarter and gave the Raptors a 100-86 lead, their biggest of the game at that point.

TORONTO — Jaylen Brown scored 24 points, Derrick White had 22 and the Boston Celtics extended their winning streak to six games by beating the Toronto Raptors 111-101 on Tuesday night ... Payton Pritchard scored 20 points and Jayson Tatum had 19 points and 11 assists as the Celtics improved to 24-6 on the road ... RJ Barrett scored 22 points and Scottie Barnes had 21 but the Raptors lost for the seventh time in their past nine. Gradey Dick scored 12 points and Immanuel Quickley added 10 ... Toronto finished 5 for 32 from 3-point range, its fewest made 3s of the season ... Kristaps Porzingis was scratched shortly before tip-off because of a non-COVID illness ... Torrey Craig replaced Porzingis in the starting lineup, his first start with Boston ... The Celtics were also without Jrue Holiday (rest). Al Horford (left big toe) and Luke Kornet (personal) ... Toronto snapped a 10-game losing streak against Boston when they last met on Jan. 15 but couldn't build on that victory in their latest encounter with the Atlantic leaders ... Toronto trailed by 17 early in the fourth but cut the deficit to seven, 102-95, on Jamal Shead's basket with 4:18 remaining. Tatum scored with 2:42 left, then stole the ball from Dick. White's sixth 3-pointer restored Boston's double-digit edge.

# ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES ...

- Maple Leafs Sports and Entertainment further extended the contract of Raptors General Bobby Webster on Aug. 18.
- The Raptors signed centre Jakob Poeltl to a multi-year contract extension on Jul. 8. Poeltl averaged career highs of 14.5 points, 9.6 rebounds and 29.6 minutes in 57 games (56 starts) last season. He ranked fifth in the NBA with a .627 (363-579) field goal percentage, his eighth consecutive season shooting better than 60 percent from the floor.
- Toronto selected forward Collin Murray-Boyles with the ninth overall pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft. Murray-Boyles, 6-foot-7, 239 pounds, was an All-SEC Second Team selection after averaging 16.8 points, 8.3 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 30.6 minutes in 32 games (all starts) as a sophomore at South Carolina last season.
- The Raptors also selected guard Alijah Martin with the 39th overall pick (second round) in the 2025 NBA Draft. Martin, 6-foot-2, 208 pounds, was drafted following one season at the University of Florida, where he helped the Gators capture the 2025 national championship. He averaged 14.4 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 1.5 steals and 30.4 minutes in 38 games (36 starts). Martin shot .452 (189-418) from the field, including 35 percent (79-226) from three-point range.
- Last season, the Raptors set franchise records including a single-game record for total rebounds with 73 boards on Mar. 10 vs. Washington.
   Toronto finished with 3,700 total rebounds on the season which is third-most in franchise history. Toronto finished 10th in the league in total rebounds and in rebounds per game (45.1).
- The Raptors also broke the single-season franchise record in total assists on the last game of the season finishing with 2,340 assists and surpassing the previous franchise record of 2,335 that was set following the 2023-24.

# DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ

# **HEAD COACH**

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007)

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their son, Luka.
