The Toronto Raptors outscored the Memphis Grizzlies 25-to-11 in fast break points. Heading into tonight, the Raptors ranked ninth overall in the NBA in fast break points per game (17.7).

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Memphis Grizzlies on Sunday night to earn their first home win of the season and improve to 3-4 overall and 1-2 at Scotiabank Arena. The Raptors will look extend their win streak (Oct. 31 Nov. 2) when they host the Milwaukee Bucks again for the second game of the season series on Tuesday.
- The Raptors shot 50.6% (45-89) from the field and improve to 2-1 when shooting .500-or-better this season. Toronto also improves to 3-0 when keeping opponents to shooting under 44% this year.
- The Raptors have had a player score 20+ points 15 times this season led by RJ Barrett and Brandon Ingram who have done so in a team-high five games. Barrett scored a game-high 27 points (10-19 FG) marking a season-high and finished a game-high +19 on the floor. Ingram finished with 26 points (10-15 FG) and has now scored 20+ points in three consecutive games (Oct. 29 Nov. 2) and in five of his last six contests.
- Scottie Barnes recorded 19 points and a season-high 12 rebounds for his team-leading third double-double of the season. He also added eight assists a season-high five blocks and one steal in 32 minutes of action. Barnes (82) ranks fourth all-time in double-doubles by a Raptor 24 years of age or younger.
- After going scoreless in his NBA debut, Collin Murray-Boyles has scored in double digits in three of his last four games (Oct. 27 – Nov. 2). He finished with 15 points, a career-high nine rebounds, five assists and three steals in his third straight start. Entering play, Murray-Boyles ranked ninth in scoring average among rookies.

GRIZZLIES NOTES

- With five players on the injury report for tonight's game, including Canadians Zach Edey and Brandon Clarke, the
 Memphis Grizzlies dropped Sunday evening's contest 117-104 against the Toronto Raptors at Scotiabank Arena.
 Prior to tonight, the Grizzlies had won five straight games against the Raptors in Toronto. Memphis will now begin a
 four-game home stand (Nov. 3-9) against the Detroit Pistons, Houston Rockets, Dallas Mavericks, and the Oklahoma
 City Thunder, respectively.
- Jaren Jackson Jr led Memphis with 20 points and nine rebounds in 32 minutes of play. Jackson Jr is the only Grizzlies player to score in double-digits in all seven games played to start the season. He averaged 26.5 points through two games against the Raptors during the 2024-25 NBA season.
- Santi Aldama led bench scorers with a season-high 15 points (5-14 FG, 2-7 3PT) and recorded four rebounds and two assists in 28 minutes of action.
- Jock Landale and Vince Williams Jr scored 14 points apiece for the Grizzlies. Landale's 14 were three points shy of his season-high (17) and tonight marked the third time he recorded a perfect stat line from the three-point field goal line this season (2-2 3PT). Eight of Williams Jr's 14 points came during the fourth quarter as the Grizzlies tried to make a push down the stretch.
