All five Raptors starters scored in double-digits for the sixth time this season. Raptors had 17 such games during the 2024-25 are 5-3 when six-or-more players score in double-digits this season.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors returned home following a five-game road trip, tied for their longest of the year (Nov. 7-15). In just their fifth game at Scotiabank Arena this year, Toronto defeated the Charlotte Hornets 110-108 in thanks to game clinching blocks by Brandon Ingram and Scottie Barnes down the stretch to secure their fourth straight victory and have now won eight of their last nine contests (Oct. 31 – Nov. 17), improving to a 6-1 record in the month of November. The Raptors will travel for a brief stop in Philadelphia on Nov. 19 before returning home for a four-game homestand (Nov. 21-26).
- Brandon Ingram led Raptors scorers with 27 points, just three points shy of a season high. Ingram's three three-point field goals mark the fifth time he has knocked down multiple triples this season and he leads the team with five games with 25+ points this season. He now 52 points away from securing 10,000 career points.
- Scottie Barnes recorded 16 points, six rebounds, and dished out a team-high six assists, two blocks, and a steal. Barnes has now recorded at least one block and one steal in a career-high 10 straight games (Oct. 29 - Nov. 17) marking a franchise record. The previous high was nine straight by Vince Carter. Last week, Barnes tied Charles Barkley for the fifth-fastest player in NBA history to record 5,000+ points, 2,000+ rebounds, and 500+ steals (steals + blocks) in their career, doing so in 289 games.
- Immanuel Quickley recorded a season-high ten rebounds and 15 points for his first double-double of a season. All ten of his rebounds came on the defensive side, which marks a season-high for him as well.

**HORNETS NOTES**

- The Charlotte Hornets fell to the Toronto Raptors on Monday night have now dropped three straight games (Nov. 14-17) and are 4-10 through the first 14 games. The Hornets will complete their two-game road trip (Nov. 17-19) on Wednesday against the Indiana Pacers.
- LaMelo Ball returned to action after missing his last game due to a right ankle injury. Monday's contest marked just his eighth game of the season. He finished with 20 points marking his first 20+ point game since he went on a four-game streak (Oct. 22-28) of 20+ points to the start season. Ball eclipsed 5,000 career points in his last game becoming the ninth player in NBA history to record at least 5,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,500 assists within his first 250 career games. He added eight assists, five rebounds and one steal in 28 minutes of action Monday.
- Rookie Kon Knueppel, who was selected with the fourth overall pick in the 2025 NBA Draft, scored a team-high 24 points and added seven rebounds, three steals and one assist in 36 minutes. Tonight marks his sixth game of 20+ points which leads all rookies this season. Entering tonight, Knueppel also led all rookies in total points, three-point field goals, second in field and fifth in rebounds.
- Miles Bridges finished with 22 points, eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and one block. He has scored 20+ points in seven of his last nine games (Nov. 1-17). Bridges passed Gerald Wallace for fourth place on the franchise's all-time leaderboard for field goals made (2,587) last game.
- Rookie Ryan Kalkbrenner, who has started in all 13 games, grabbed a game-high tying 10 rebounds. He has recorded double digit rebounds for the third time this season.
