TEAM NOTES

- The **Toronto Raptors** are back in the city to begin a four-game homestand (Nov. 21-26), marking their longest homestand of the season so far. Two out of the four games are NBA Cup nights, including Friday night's matchup against the Washington Wizards, and the final two games of group play. The Raptors are 2-0 in group play and sit atop Group A following two victories against the Cleveland Cavaliers and the Atlanta Hawks earlier this season. The top team following group play will automatically advance to the knockout rounds - with a chance to advance to the semifinals in December. Toronto has an opportunity to clinch the group with a win and an Indiana loss Friday night.
- The **Raptors** have won a season-high five straight games (Nov. 11-19), improving to a 10-5 record, winning nine out of their last ten games, their best record in a ten-game span since Feb. 2020. Toronto's record is second overall in the Eastern Conference, a feat they haven't achieved since August of 2020.
- Wednesday night's victory over the Philadelphia 76ers saw all five starters in double-digits for the seventh time this season, which marks the most such games overall in the league. Along with **Ja'Kobe Walter's** season-high 11 points off the bench, Toronto is now 6-3 when six-or-more players score in double-digits this season. The **Raptors** have also shot .500 or better as a team in four consecutive games, which ties a franchise record.
- Brandon Ingram** and **RJ Barrett** each recorded a team-high 22 points against Philadelphia Wednesday night. This marked Ingram's 10th 20-point performance this season and Barrett's ninth - Barrett has lead the team in scoring eight times this season, a team-best.

- Recorded 22 points (7-10 FG, 2-2 3PT) and dished out five assists in 31 minutes of play Wednesday night.
- Has recorded 2+ three-point field goals in consecutive games (Nov. 17-19) for the second time this season.
- Leads team with five games with 25+ points this season and has scored 20+ points ten times.

F - SCOTTIE BARNES #4 MIN: 32.8 REB: 7.8 AST: 5.3 STL: 1.40 TO: 2.1 BLK: 1.73 PTS: 19.2

- Finished with 16 points, nine rebounds, five assists, a steal and a block Wednesday night at Philadelphia.
- Recorded 5+ rebounds in seven consecutive games (Nov. 7-19); leads team with 117 rebounds this season.
- Has recorded one block and one steal in a career-high 11 consecutive games, setting the franchise record.

C - JAKOB POELTL #19 MIN: 26.0 REB: 7.5 AST: 1.9 STL: 0.64 TO: 1.2 BLK: 0.55 PTS: 12.0

- Scored 19 points, eight rebounds, four assists, and a steal in 33 minutes of action against the 76ers.
- Averaging 73.3 percent from the field (55 - 75) to start the season; ranks third overall in NBA this season.
- Has shot 70% or better in last six games (Nov. 7 - 19) and has shot above .800 in five of those six games.

G - RJ BARRETT #9 MIN: 31.7 REB: 4.8 AST: 3.9 STL: 0.80 TO: 1.5 BLK: 0.27 PTS: 19.3

- Recorded a team-high tying 22 points and added four assists and three rebounds in 34 minutes at Philadelphia.
- Made multiple three-point field goals in two of last three games played; second on team in 3PT field goals (27).
- Begins the season shooting .500 from the field (107 - 214); a career-high in FG% through any first 15 games.

G - IMMANUEL QUICKLEY #5 MIN: 31.8 REB: 4.7 AST: 6.1 STL: 1.40 TO: 1.7 BLK: 0.00 PTS: 15.9

- Finished with 18 points, a team-high tying six assists, five rebounds and three steals Wednesday night.
- One of just eight players in the Eastern Conference to have recorded 90+ assists so far this season.
- Leads team in 3PT FGs (37); Has 2+ 3PT FGs in nine straight games - third-best streak in his career.

Jakob Poeltl scored 19 points, and Immanuel Quickley had 18 — hitting two 3-pointers in the final two minutes — to help the Raptors win for the ninth time in 10 games ... Scottie Barnes added 16 points, nine rebounds and five assists ... Tyrese Maxey led the 76ers with 24 points. VJ Edgecombe and Quentin Grimes had 21 points each ... The 76ers led 56-53 at halftime behind 15 points from Maxey ... Toronto took the lead with an 18-7 run to start the third quarter, powered by seven points from Ingram ... The Raptors outscored the 76ers 44-28 in the period ... Toronto shot 2 for 15 from 3-point range in the first half, then went 5 for 6 from deep in the third quarter ... Paul George, who made his season debut Monday, was held out as part of management of his left knee injury ... Raptors rookie forward Collin Murray-Boyles missed the game because of a right knee MCL sprain.

Immanuel Quickley had 21 points and seven assists for Toronto ... Scottie Barnes finished with 13 points, 10 boards and eight assists ... Washington lost its fifth consecutive game. Jordan Poole scored 23 points for the Wizards, and AJ Johnson had 17 ... Bub Carrington finished with 15 points, 11 rebounds and six assists ... The Wizards lost Keyonte George after the guard sprained his left ankle early in the game ... The 21-year-old George got hurt while going for a rebound ... Poeltl scored 12 points to lead Toronto to a 52-50 lead at the break. Jamison Battle made a jumper and a 3-pointer to make it 95-87 with 6:26 left in the game ... Poeltl was 10 for 13 from the field and blocked three shots in a solid all-around performance ... The Wizards went 23 for 34 at the free-throw line, compared to 20 for 27 for the Raptors ... Ochai Agbaji had a driving dunk and A.J. Lawson converted a layup to help the Raptors open a 108-98 lead with 2:20 left.

Ingram scored 27 points, Barnes and Barrett each had 16 and Immanuel Quickley added 15 points and 10 rebounds as Toronto won its fourth straight ... Ingram got the crowd on its feet with an eye-popping fourth quarter dunk over Hornets rookie center Ryan Kalkbrenner ... After Barrett's go-ahead basket, Ingram maintained the lead by blocking Kalkbrenner from behind ... On the final possession, Barnes sealed it by blocking Collin Sexton's putback attempt at the buzzer ... Jakob Poeltl scored 13 points and Grady Dick had 10 for Toronto ... Kon Knueppel scored 24 points, Miles Bridges added 22 and LaMelo Ball had 20 ... Kalkbrenner led Charlotte with 10 rebounds ... Barnes set a Raptors franchise record by recording at least one block and one steal in his 10th consecutive game, a career-best. Vince Carter did it in nine straight games for Toronto from April 1 to 16, 1999.

The Raptors won for the fifth time in six games ... They shot 49.5% (45 for 91) from the field and outrebounded the Nets 50-36 ... Nic Claxton and Michael Porter Jr. each had 21 points for Brooklyn, losers of 10 of its first 11 games to start the season ... The Nets are winless in six games at home ... Playing its third game of a five-game trip, Toronto led 60-52 at halftime and increased its lead to 14 points early in the third quarter ... Brooklyn closed to 83-81 late in the third, but Toronto responded with three consecutive baskets, including a buzzer-beating floater from Jamal Shad ... Quickley's 3-pointer sparked a 7-0 run for the Raptors that made it 102-89 with 7:41 left ... Toronto has won in its last three visits to Barclays Center.

ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES ...

- Maple Leafs Sports and Entertainment further extended the contract of Raptors General Bobby Webster on Aug. 18.
- The Raptors signed centre Jakob Poeltl to a multi-year contract extension on Jul. 8. Poeltl averaged career highs of 14.5 points, 9.6 rebounds and 29.6 minutes in 57 games (56 starts) last season. He ranked fifth in the NBA with a .627 (363-579) field goal percentage, his eighth consecutive season shooting better than 60 percent from the floor.
- Toronto selected forward Collin Murray-Boyles with the ninth overall pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft. Murray-Boyles, 6-foot-7, 239 pounds, was an All-SEC Second Team selection after averaging 16.8 points, 8.3 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 30.6 minutes in 32 games (all starts) as a sophomore at South Carolina last season.
- The Raptors also selected guard Alijah Martin with the 39th overall pick (second round) in the 2025 NBA Draft. Martin, 6-foot-2, 208 pounds, was drafted following one season at the University of Florida, where he helped the Gators capture the 2025 national championship. He averaged 14.4 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 1.5 steals and 30.4 minutes in 38 games (36 starts). Martin shot .452 (189-418) from the field, including 35 percent (79-226) from three-point range.
- Last season, the Raptors set franchise records including a single-game record for total rebounds with 73 boards on Mar. 10 vs. Washington. DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ

HEAD COACH

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007)

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their son, Luka.
