KEY STAT

The Toronto Raptors scored 26 points off of the Brooklyn Nets' 19 turnovers and committed a season-low nine turnovers.

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors continued a four-game homestand (Nov. 21-26) with a 119-109 win over the Brooklyn Nets in the first game of a back-to-back set Sunday night. Toronto takes a 2-0 lead over Brooklyn in their four-game season series. The Raptors have now won a season-high seven consecutive games; including five straight victories at Scotiabank Arena. They will face the Cleveland Cavaliers Monday night in the second game of a back-to-back set; with the Cavaliers coming into town following their own back-to-back game against the LA Clippers Sunday night. Toronto holds a 2-1 (.667) record in the first game of their back-to-back sets to start the season.
- Scottie Barnes led Raptors scorers with 17 points, seven rebounds, four assists, four blocks, and two steals in 34 minutes of action. Barnes has recorded multiple blocks in eight games this season and for the 74th time in his career; which ranks 12th overall in franchise history.
- Brandon Ingram added 14 points (6-18 FG, 2-5 3PT), six rebounds, four assists, and two steals in 36 minutes of play. Ingram has now surpassed 10,000 career points and is the fifth player from the 2016 NBA Draft class to achieve this milestone; being the quickest to do so in 512 career games.
- Ja'Kobe Walter led Raptors reserves for the second time this season with a season-high 16 points, including a season-high four three-point goals. His previous high was 11 points (3-4 3PT) Nov. 19 at Philadelphia.
- Immanuel Quickley scored eight of his 13 points in the fourth quarter to help lift the Raptors to a victory. Quickley has now recorded multiple three-point field goals in ten straight games, which is tied for the second-longest streak of his career.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili made his first start as a Raptor this season and recorded 12 points (5-9 FG, 2-4 3PT), adding four rebounds, two assists and a steal in 27 minutes on the floor.

NETS NOTES

- The Brooklyn Nets fell to the Toronto Raptors on Sunday night and have lost the second game of the season series. The Nets return home splitting their two-game road trip (Nov. 21-23) 1-1. Brooklyn returns home for a two-game homestand (Nov. 24-28) starting with the New York Knicks on Wednesday.
- The Nets outrebounded the Raptors 40-to-32 (+8) but fall to 2-1 when outrebounding opponents on the road.
- Tyrese Martin led all players with a season-high 26 points (7-14 FG, 5-9 3PT, 7-7 FT) in 25 minutes off the bench. Tonight marks his sixth career 20-point game and is the most points off the bench by a Net this season. His 26 points are also the most a player has scored off the bench against the Raptors this season.
- Michael Porter Jr. contributed 25 points (9-18 FG, 4-9 3PT, 3-3 FT) and added six rebounds, four assists, one steal and one block in 33 minutes. He extends his career-long streak to nine straight games with 20+ points, tying Cam Thomas (Mar. 27 – Apr. 12, 2024) and Mikal Bridges (Mar. 23 – Apr. 7, 2023) as the longest such streaks by a Net since Kevin Durant's 14 from Dec. 4, 2022 to Jan. 6, 2023.
- Nic Claxton (10 points, 11 rebounds) recorded his team-leading fourth double-double of the season. It is the 80th of his career, which moves him to a tie with Keith Van Horn for the ninth-most in franchise history. He has two blocks tonight and now 556 in his career, three shy of tying Derrick Coleman (559) for the fifth-most as a Net.
- Noah Clowney finished with a season-high 22 points for his first 20-point game of the season and fifth of his career.
