KEY STAT

The Toronto Raptors outrebounded the Cleveland Cavaliers 51-to-37 (+14); including 10-to-4 on offensive rebounds and 41-to-33 on the defensive side of the glass. Toronto is now 9-0 when outrebounding their opponents this season.

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Cleveland Cavaliers in the second game of a back-to-back set and have swept the season series 3-0. The Raptors have now won 12 of their last 13 games (Oct. 31 – Nov. 24) and have won eight straight games for the first time streak since Jan. 29 – Feb. 10, 2022.
- The Raptors outrebounded the Cavaliers 51-to-37 (+14) and improve to 4-0 when recording 50+ rebounds this season. Toronto is 147-54 all-time when recording 50+ rebounds.
- Toronto will complete their four-game homestand (Nov. 21-26) on Wednesday by hosting the Indiana Pacers and will mark the final round robin game of the NBA Cup. The Raptors clinched East Group A and a birth to the quarter-finals last week.
- Brandon Ingram recorded a season-high 37 points in 37 minutes tonight. His previous high was 29 points (2X - last: Oct. 29 vs. Houston). This marks his first 30-point performance since Nov. 16, 2024 when he scored 32 points vs. LA Lakers. Ingram's 12 games of 20+ points are the most through the first 18 games by a Raptor since Pascal Siakam did so in the 2019-20 season.
- Scottie Barnes recorded 11 rebounds and scored 18 points for his team-leading eighth double-double of the season and 87th of his career, passing Damon Stoudamire for seventh in Raptors franchise history.
- Jakob Poeltl returned to action after sitting yesterday's game due to lower back injury management and grabbed a season-high 13 rebounds marking his third 10+ rebound game of the season. Poeltl has grabbed nine-or-more rebounds in seven of his last nine games.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili recorded 12 points and a season-high nine boards in 21 minutes off the bench. He has now led the bench in scoring in a team-high eight games.

CAVALIERS NOTES

- The Cleveland Cavaliers – who were missing seven players tonight – dropped their second game of a back-to-back set 110-99 against the Toronto Raptors Monday night. Cleveland loses the season series 0-3 against Toronto and will now travel to Atlanta for the final game of this brief road trip (Nov. 23-24) ahead of returning home to finish the month of November against the Boston Celtics (Nov. 30).
- The Cavaliers went 14-of-48 from the three-point line as a team and extended their streak of 10+ threes to 106 consecutive regular season games. Going back to April 6, 2024, this continues to be the NBA record. The previous mark was 97 consecutive games by the Houston Rockets (Dec. 13, 2018 – Jan. 18, 2020).
- Donovan Mitchell led Cavs scorers with 17 points – ten of which came within the fourth quarter and dished out a team-high eight assists in 34 minutes. Mitchell entered tonight as one of two NBA players this season shooting .515 or more from the field on 300+ field goals attempted, joining OKC's Shai Gilgeous-Alexander.
- Jaylon Tyson added 15 points – just four points shy of a season-high – and grabbed a team-high nine rebounds in his third game back after missing five games (Nov. 12-19) due to a concussion.
- Evan Mobley finished with 14 points, five rebounds, four assists, and a block in 31 minutes. He is now two blocks away from tying Jim Chones for sixth-most blocks in Cavs franchise history (448).
- Nae'Qwan Tomlin led Cleveland bench scorers with 14 points for third game with 10+ points this season.
