### TEAM NOTES

- The **Toronto Raptors** begin the month of December with their longest homestand of the season (Dec. 2-9) to date, set to play five games at Scotiabank Arena. They will face the Portland Trail Blazers on Tuesday night in hopes of continuing their current seven-game winning streak at home. Toronto enters play having dropped four straight against Portland.
- Toronto dropped their second consecutive game to the New York Knicks on Sunday night, going win-less in a back-to-back set on the road (Nov. 29-30). They allowed a season-high tying 41 points in the first quarter from the Knicks and recorded a season-low tying 17 points in the fourth quarter in the 116-94 loss. This marks the team's largest margin of loss of the year. Despite the two losses, the Raptors finished the month of November with a 10-3 (.769) record compared to a 4-11 (.267) finish in November last season.
- Immanuel Quickley** led Raptors scorers with 19 points (7-14 FG, 4-10 3PT) and a game-high eight assists against his former team. Quickley has knocked down four or more three-point field goals for the fifth time this season, something he did just seven times last season.
- Scottie Barnes** added 18 points, five rebounds, four assists, two blocks and a steal in 32 minutes of action Sunday night. Barnes recorded a season-high tying four 3PT field goals.
- Raptors rookie **Collin Murray-Boyles** led the team's reserves with 11 points and eight rebounds, adding two assists and a steal in 22 minutes off the bench for his sixth double-digit performance of the season. Murray-Boyles ranks third among NBA rookies in field-goal percentage this season with .519 (41 - 79) and is within the top ten in rebounds per game (3.4).

- Added 14 points, four assists, and one rebound in 32 minutes against the New York Knicks Sunday night.
- Has recorded 20+ points in seven of last nine contests averaging 22.8 points while shooting 45.4% in that span.
- Enters play averaging 20+ points in four of his previous five seasons against the Portland Trail Blazers.

#### F - SCOTTIE BARNES #4 MIN: 33.4 REB: 8.0 AST: 5.0 STL: 1.43 TO: 2.3 BLK: 1.62 PTS: 19.9

- Scored 18 points, including a season-high tying four three-point field goals, & five rebounds against New York.
- Leads the team in three categories this season: total rebounds (167), steals (30), and blocks (34).
- Is the only player in the NBA with 150+ rebounds, 30+ steals, and 30+ blocks this season.

#### C - JAKOB POELTL #19 MIN: 26.4 REB: 8.3 AST: 2.3 STL: 0.80 TO: 1.4 BLK: 0.60 PTS: 10.5

- Missed Sunday's game against the New York Knicks due to Lower Back; Injury Management.
- Shooting career-high .728 (67 - 92) to start the season, Ranked 1st in the NBA among players with 90+ FGA.
- Has recorded nine-or-more rebounds in last four games (Nov. 21-29) including 10+ twice.

#### G - JA'KOB WALTER #14 MIN: 15.8 REB: 2.1 AST: 0.7 STL: 1.00 TO: 0.7 BLK: 0.17 PTS: 5.1

- Recorded seven points, four rebounds, and added two blocks in his third start with Toronto this season.
- Averaging 5.7 points, 4.7 rebounds, 0.7 assists and 24.3 minutes in three starts with Toronto this year.
- Exercised the third-year team option on his rookie scale contract Oct. 21.

#### G - IMMANUEL QUICKLEY #5 MIN: 32.2 REB: 4.6 AST: 6.3 STL: 1.24 TO: 1.7 BLK: 0.05 PTS: 16.0

- Led Raptors scorers with 19 points (7-14 FG, 4-10 3PT) and dished out eight assists Sunday night.
- Has made multiple three-point field goals in 15 of 21 games; Leads team with 52 total 3PT field goals.
- Averaging career highs of 17.4 points, 6.3 assists and 4.3 rebounds in 92 career games with Toronto.

**NEW YORK** — Josh Hart had 20 points, 12 rebounds and seven assists, Karl-Anthony Towns added 22 points and eight rebounds and the New York Knicks beat the Toronto Raptors 116-94 on Sunday for their fourth straight victory ... Jalen Brunson had 18 points, seven assists and six rebounds, and Mikal Bridges and Miles McBride each scored 14 points ... Immanuel Quickley had 19 points and eight assists for Toronto against his former team, and Scottie Barnes added 18 points ... The Raptors dropped to 14-7, a night after their nine-game winning streak ended at Charlotte ... The Knicks and Raptors will meet in the NBA Cup Eastern Conference semifinals in Toronto on Dec. 9 ... The Knicks nearly blew a 24-point first-half lead to the resilient Raptors, who cut New York's lead to three at 70-67 midway through the third ... But Hart and Bridges keyed a 16-1 run over a 4:20 span to help the Knicks pull away again. Hart had eight points, with two made 3-pointers, and Bridges scored six points on the run and assisted on each of Hart's 3s.

**TORONTO** — Shaedon Sharpe scored 36 points to lead the Portland Trail Blazers past the Toronto Raptors 112-103 on Thursday night ... Sharpe, from London, Ontario, was in an all-Canadian backcourt with Toronto's D'Alano Banton as Portland (34-43) won back-to-back games to keep its Western Conference postseason hopes alive ... Sharpe added six rebounds and five assist ... Banton added 23 points ... Deni Avdija finished with 26 points and 15 rebounds for Trail Blazers ... RJ Barrett, of Mississauga, Ontario, had 18 points, five rebounds and four assists for Toronto (28-49) ... Orlando Robinson added 14 points ... Ochai Agbaji finished with 15 points and A.J. Lawson, of Brampton, Ontario, 13 off the bench ... Because Toronto's looking at a lottery pick, head coach Darko Rajakovic leaned on his depth with an eye to developing young players for next season. As a result, the Raptors reserves outscored Portland's 47-14, but the Trail Blazers ran a shorter bench to seal the win.

Collin Sexton came off the bench to score 18 points and handled most of the point guard duties after LaMelo Ball went to the bench early in the fourth quarter for what coach Charles Lee said was a "minutes restriction" while playing on back-to-back nights ... Scottie Barnes had 30 points and 12 rebounds to lead the Raptors, whose last loss came on Nov. 8 against Philadelphia ... Brandon Ingram and Immanuel Quickley each scored 22 points for Toronto.

Davis was hit in the face by Jakob Poeltl's off hand while he blocked the Toronto center's dunk attempt with 5:16 left in the third quarter ... James had 19 points, a season-high 16 assists and 10 rebounds in his third triple-double already this season ... Austin Reaves scored 27 points for the Lakers, who improved to 5-0 at home ... Los Angeles also beat Toronto for the second time in nine days ... Chris Boucher and RJ Barrett scored 18 points apiece for the Raptors, who have lost four straight and eight of nine ... Immanuel Quickley scored 12 points and played back-to-back games in LA after missing eight straight with a pelvic bruise ... Poeltl had 14 points and 10 rebounds while playing well against Davis on both ends ... After trailing by double digits early, the Lakers finished the third quarter on a 16-5 run right after Davis' injury before roaring away ... LA took the lead for good on rookie Dalton Knecht's 3-pointer.

## ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES ...

- Won nine straight games (Nov. 11-26) which tied the fourth-longest winning streak in Raptors franchise history.
- Set a franchise record in points scored in a third quarter with 48 points on Nov. 21 vs. Washington.
- Set a franchise record by shooting 50%+ from the field in five consecutive games (Nov. 13-21).
- Maple Leafs Sports and Entertainment further extended the contract of Raptors General Bobby Webster on Aug. 18.
- The Raptors signed centre Jakob Poeltl to a multi-year contract extension on Jul. 8. Poeltl averaged career highs of 14.5 points, 9.6 rebounds and 29.6 minutes in 57 games (56 starts) last season. He ranked fifth in the NBA with a .627 (363-579) field goal percentage, his eighth consecutive season shooting better than 60 percent from the floor.
- Toronto selected forward Collin Murray-Boyles with the ninth overall pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft. Murray-Boyles, 6-foot-7, 239 pounds, was an All-SEC Second Team selection after averaging 16.8 points, 8.3 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 30.6 minutes in 32 games (all starts) as a sophomore at South Carolina last season.
- The Raptors also selected guard Alijah Martin with the 39th overall pick (second round) in the 2025 NBA Draft. Martin, 6-foot-2, 208 pounds, was drafted following one season at the University of Florida, where he helped the Gators capture the 2025 national championship. ## **DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ** **HEAD COACH**

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007)

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their son, Luka.
