The Toronto Raptors outscored the Portland Trail Blazers in fastbreak points 25-to-10. Entering play, Toronto lead the NBA in fastbreak points per game (20.2).

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Portland Trail Blazers 121-118 Tuesday night at Scotiabank Arena, snapping a two-game losing streak and extending their winning streak at home to eight straight in Toronto. The Raptors will continue their five-game homestand (Dec. 2-9) with a back-to-back set against the Los Angeles Lakers and the Charlotte Hornets later this week (Dec. 4-5).
- Scottie Barnes led with a game-high 28 points (10-18 FG, 3-7 3PT) and added seven rebounds, seven assists, and two blocks in 39 minutes of action. He has now recorded three-or-more three-point field goals in consecutive games for the second time this season, something he only did once last season. Earlier today, Barnes was named Eastern Conference Defensive Player of the Month for October/November. During this stretch, Barnes recorded 64 'stocks' (steals + blocks), tied for most in the NBA, and was the only player in the league with 30+ steals and 30+ blocks.
- Immanuel Quickley finished with 23 points and a season-high tying five three-point field goals for his fifth game with 20+ points this season. His team-high eight assists and five rebounds marked his 17th game with 20/5/5 in a Raptor uniform, tying Doug Christie for 10th overall in Raptors franchise history.
- Brandon Ingram scored 21 points and added six rebounds and three assists for his 15th game with 20+ points this season.
- Gradey Dick and Collin Murray-Boyles led the Raptors bench in double-digit scoring Tuesday night. Dick's 14 points came on a season-high tying six field goals in 17 minutes of play. Raptors rookie Collin Murray-Boyles added 10 points and four rebounds for his second straight game in double-digits. Entering play, Murray-Boyles was ranked third among NBA rookies in field goal percentage (.519).
- Jamal Sheard's game-high and career-high five steals – which all came within the first half - are tied for the most in a half by a Raptors bench player, tying a record set by former Raptor CJ Miles on Jan. 19, 2019.

TRAIL BLAZERS NOTES

- The Portland Trail Blazers started their five-game road trip (Dec. 2-11) with a loss to the Raptors on Tuesday night and have now lost three straight games. The Trail Blazers visit Cleveland tomorrow for a back-to-back set.
- Deni Avdija scored a team-high 25 points and added a career-high 14 assists for his second consecutive double-double after recording a triple-double in his last game vs. Oklahoma City. Tonight marks his fourth game of 10+ assists this season after doing so just two times last season. He has also scored 20+ points in four straight games and entered play averaging career highs of 25.8 points and 5.8 assists this season.
- Toumani Camara scored 14 of his season-high 21 points in the first quarter. He has scored double digits in four straight (Nov. 24 – Dec. 2). Camara has scored 10+ points in 16 of 21 games played this season.
- London, Ont. Native Shaedon Sharpe led all reserves with 23 points on 9-for-18 shooting in 30 minutes off the bench. Sharpe was averaging a career high 20.9 points entering tonight. His previous high was 18.5 points last season.
- Donovan Clingan finished with 11 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. He has now grabbed double digit rebounds in three straight games (Nov. 26 – Dec. 2) and in seven of his last eight contests. Entering play, he has totaled 190 rebounds averaging 10.0 per game which was ninth best in the league. His 93 offensive rebounds leads the NBA.
