KEY STAT

The Boston Celtics' 77 points in the first 24 minutes are the most the Toronto Raptors have allowed in a first half since Dec. 26, 2024 – when the Memphis Grizzlies scored 78. Boston also recorded 20 three-point field goals tonight, marking the highest number of three-point field goals an opponent has recorded against the Raptors this season.

RAPTORS NOTES

- Despite overcoming a 23-point deficit, the Toronto Raptors fell to the Boston Celtics in a Sunday matinee matchup at Scotiabank Arena and have now lost three consecutive games, all of which have come within their current five-game homestand (Dec. 2-9). Toronto will face Boston once more this month on Dec. 20, marking the second and final matchup at home in the season series – the Raptors will face the Celtics in Boston for the last two games of the season series. Toronto's next game is slated for Tuesday night as they face the New York Knicks in the NBA Cup quarterfinal knockout round. A victory would send the Raptors to Las Vegas for their first-ever appearance in the NBA Cup semifinals.
- Brandon Ingram led Raptors scorers with 30 points (11-20 FG, 4-7 3PT), adding four rebounds and three assists in 35 minutes of action. He has now recorded 20+ points 17 times in 25 games played this season, including 30+ twice.
- Scottie Barnes finished with 18 points and 11 rebounds for his 12th double-double of the season. He also dished out a team-high eight assists for his fourth consecutive game with five-or-more assists.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili led Raptors reserves for the tenth time this season, recording 14 points and six rebounds in 23 minutes off the bench.
- Ochai Agbaji recorded a season-high 11 points for his first double-digit scoring performance of the season after missing the last two games due to personal reasons. His previous high was six points (2X - last: Nov. 30 at New York). Agbaji scored 10+ points in a career-high 35 games last season.
- Raptors two-way player AJ Lawson saw his first minutes of the season tonight, scoring ten points and adding five rebounds in 13 minutes off the bench. Lawson is averaging 25.0 points, 4.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists, 2.1 steals and 31.8 minutes in nine Tip-Off Tournament games (all starts) with the Raptors 905 in the NBA G League, including a season-high 36-point performance on Dec. 5 vs. Capital City Go-Go.

CELTICS NOTES

- The Boston Celtics defeated the Raptors in the first game of a four-game series and have now won a season-high five consecutive games (Nov. 30 – Dec. 7) and 10 of their last 12 contests (Nov. 23 – Dec. 7). The Celtics, who did not make the NBA Cup knockout round, will next face the Bucks in Milwaukee on Dec. 11.
- Boston committed 11 turnovers tonight and entered play leading the NBA with the fewest turnovers per game (11.8).
- Jaylen Brown scored a game-high tying 30 points and has now 30+ points in three consecutive games (Dec. 2-7) and for the 13th time this season already surpassing his mark from last year (9). Entering tonight, Brown ranked seventh in the NBA in scoring, averaging a career-high 29.0 points per game.
- Derrick White poured in 27 points and has scored 20+ points in three of his last four games averaging 24.5 points in that span. He has scored 20+ points in consecutive games against the Raptors and for the fifth time in his career.
- Neemias Queta recorded 11 points and a game-high tying 11 rebounds for his team-leading fifth double-double of the season. Jaylen Brown has second-most with three. Queta shot 50%+ for the 19th time in 22 games this season and entered play ranked fourth in shooting percentage (.662).
