TEAM NOTES

- The **Toronto Raptors** will begin a five-game homestand (Dec. 28 - Jan. 5), matching their longest of the season when they face the Golden State Warriors for a Sunday matinee. The last time Toronto faced the Warriors at home, Toronto took the matchup 104-101. Sunday's game marks one of two set matchups against Golden State this season and they will face once more on Jan. 20 to even out the season series.
- The **Raptors** fell 138-117 to the Washington Wizards Friday night, moving to 1-1 in the season series after taking the first matchup of the season 140-110 Nov. 21. Toronto allowed 73 points in the first half of play and have now give up 70+ points in a half five times this season. They have a 3-10 record this year when trailing after the first half. Toronto was outscored in points in the paint 62-to-44 and in fastbreak points 21-to-10. The Raptors remain at the top of the league in fastbreak points, averaging 18.9 per game.
- Brandon Ingram** and **Immanuel Quickley** combined for 54 of the Raptors' 117. Ingram scored 29 points (10-20 FG) and added six rebounds, two assists, and two blocks in 33 minutes of play for his 22nd game with 20+ points this season. Quickley added 25 points, going perfect from beyond the arc (4-4 3PT) for the first time this season. His four three-point field goals are tied for his second-most made this year.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili** recorded his first double-double of the season, grabbing a season-high 11 rebounds and adding 13 points - 10 of which came in the first quarter. Mamukelashvili has now recorded 3+ three-point field goals in a career-high 5 games this season.
- Ja'Kobe Walter** led Raptors reserves with 15 points (5-7 FG) for the sixth time this year.

F - BRANDON INGRAM #3 MIN: 34.1 REB: 5.8 AST: 3.8 STL: 0.78 TO: 3.0 BLK: 0.66 PTS: 21.9

- Scored 29 points, six rebounds, two assists, and two blocks in 33 minutes of play against Washington.
- Ranked fifth overall in the NBA in minutes played this season (1090 through 32 games).
- Shooting 47.1 percent from the field in last five games (41 - 87); including 38.2 percent from three (13 - 34).

F - SCOTTIE BARNES #4 MIN: 33.8 REB: 7.9 AST: 5.1 STL: 1.28 TO: 2.7 BLK: 1.56 PTS: 19.2

- Added 14 points, dished out a team-high seven assists, and grabbed four rebounds in 29 minutes Friday night.
- Only player in the NBA this season with more than 50 total blocks and 40 total steals; leads with 91 steals.
- Averaging career-highs in points (19.2), rebounds (7.9), assists (5.1), FG% (50.0), and 3PT% (35.7).

C - SANDRO MAMUKELASHVILI #54 MIN: 21.1 REB: 4.8 AST: 1.8 STL: 0.65 TO: 0.9 BLK: 0.52 PTS: 10.5

- Recorded 13 points, a season-high 11 rebounds, two assists, two steals, and a block against Washington.
- Has recorded three or more three-point field goals in a career-high five games this year.
- His 10 points scored in the first quarter against the Wizards mark the most of any quarter played this season.

G - OCHAI AGBAJI #30 MIN: 16.7 REB: 2.3 AST: 0.8 STL: 0.54 TO: 0.3 BLK: 0.25 PTS: 4.3

- Recorded eight points, three rebounds, and two steals in 26 minutes against the Washington Wizards.
- Has started in six consecutive games with Toronto this season, averaging 5.5 points in eight total starts.
- Started in 45 games for Toronto last season and averaged 11.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 30.2 mins.

G - IMMANUEL QUICKLEY #5 MIN: 32.3 REB: 4.3 AST: 6.4 STL: 1.16 TO: 1.7 BLK: 0.13 PTS: 16.1

- Finished with 25 points, five assists, four rebounds, two steals and one block in 33 minutes of action.
- Has shot perfect from the three-point field goal line in eight instances in his career after going 4-4 Friday.
- Leads the team in three-point field goals (75) and assists (198), second in steals (36).

WASHINGTON — Kyshawn George scored 23 points on 9-of-13 shooting, and the last-place Washington Wizards beat the struggling Toronto Raptors 138-117 on Friday night ... CJ McCollum and Bilal Coulibaly each added 21 points to help the Wizards to their highest-scoring performance of the season ... The Wizards shot 59.3% (54 of 91) as a team, out-rebounded the Raptors 46-33 and outscored the visitors 36-17 in the fourth quarter ... Brandon Ingram scored 29 points and Immanuel Quickley added 25 for Toronto, which has lost nine of 13 ... Sandro Mamukelashvili had 13 points and 11 rebounds for the Raptors, who played without starters RJ Barrett (knee sprain) and Jakob Poeltl (back strain) ... Toronto closed an 11-point halftime deficit to two by the end of the third quarter before succumbing to Washington's late onslaught ... Justin Champagnie and Bub Carrington sank consecutive 3-pointers to stretch the Wizards' lead to 10 points with 10:08 to play. Later, McCollum and Carrington hit 3s sandwiched around George's running layup in a spurt that extended it to 120-104 ... Coulibaly's dunk in transition with 3:50 remaining made it a 20-point game for the first time.

SAN FRANCISCO — Jimmy Butler had 18 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists for his second triple-double with Golden State, and the Warriors held on to beat the Toronto Raptors 117-114 on Thursday night after Stephen Curry left the game with an injury ... Curry, who was held out of Tuesday's win over the Milwaukee Bucks to get rest, did not play the final 15 minutes after suffering a pelvic contusion ... Curry was going for a rebound and got undercut before crashing hard to the floor ... He remained down for several moments before getting helped to the locker room ... He finished with 17 points ... Warriors coach Steve Kerr said Curry was undergoing an MRI afterward ... He said Curry wanted to return, but the Warriors opted to play it safe ... Draymond Green added 21 points and seven rebounds for the Warriors ... Quinten Post had 18 on six 3-pointers ... Scottie Barnes had 29 points and 10 rebounds for the Raptors ... Immanuel Quickley scored 21 while Jakob Poeltl added 18 points and eight rebounds.

MIAMI — Scottie Barnes scored 27 points and grabbed eight rebounds, and the Toronto Raptors beat the reeling Miami Heat 112-91 on Tuesday night in the final pre-Christmas game for both teams ... Immanuel Quickley scored 18 for the Raptors — who got their 18th win in their 31st game of the season ... They needed 57 games last season to get to the 18-win mark and are over .500 at Christmas for the first time since the 2019-20 season ... Sandro Mamukelashvili scored 14 and Brandon Ingram finished with 12 for Toronto, which again played without RJ Barrett ... He's recovering from a sprained right knee ... Jaime Jaquez Jr. scored 21 for the Heat ... They've been held under 100 points twice this season, both by Toronto and both in losses — with Tuesday's 91-point figure the lowest. The Raptors beat the Heat 106-96 on Dec. 15 ... Norman Powell scored 17, Andrew Wiggins added 14 and Bam Adebayo grabbed 12 rebounds for the Heat. Miami played again without Tyler Herro, Nikola Jovic and Pelle Larsson, all who remain injured ... A 10-0 run in the fourth quarter pretty much put things away for Toronto, with that spurt giving the Raptors a 99-76 edge midway through the final period.

RJ Barrett had 21 points, nine assists and eight rebounds for Toronto ... Scottie Barnes added 17 points and 13 boards. Jakob Poeltl also scored 17, and Immanuel Quickley had 15 ... Franz Wagner finished with 28 points for Orlando ... Raptors starting guard Gradey Dick sat out after getting shaken up in a collision Sunday night ... Walter, a rookie from Baylor, had 17 points as the Raptors (20-42) improved to 7-23 on the road ... They won 104-102 at Orlando on Sunday night ... - Set a franchise record by shooting 50%+ from the field in five consecutive games (Nov. 13-21).
- Maple Leafs Sports and Entertainment further extended the contract of Raptors General Bobby Webster on Aug. 18.
- The Raptors signed centre Jakob Poeltl to a multi-year contract extension on Jul. 8. Poeltl averaged career highs of 14.5 points, 9.6 rebounds and 29.6 minutes in 57 games (56 starts) last season. He ranked fifth in the NBA with a .627 (363-579) field goal percentage, his eighth consecutive season shooting better than 60 percent from the floor.
- Toronto selected forward Collin Murray-Boyles with the ninth overall pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft. Murray-Boyles, 6-foot-7, 239 pounds, was an All-SEC Second Team selection after averaging 16.8 points, 8.3 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 30.6 minutes in 32 games (all starts) as a sophomore at South Carolina last season.
- The Raptors also selected guard Alijah Martin with the 39th overall pick (second round) in the 2025 NBA Draft. Martin, 6-foot-2, 208 pounds, was drafted following one season at the University of Florida, where he helped the Gators capture the 2025 national championship. He averaged 14.4 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 1.5 steals and 30.4 minutes in 38 games (36 starts). Martin shot .452 (189-418) from the field, including 35 percent (79-226) from three-point range.

DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ **HEAD COACH**

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007)

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their son, Luka.
