**KEY STAT**

The Toronto Raptors recorded a season-high 141 points and overcame a twelve-point deficit in the fourth quarter - their largest fourth quarter comeback since Nov. 13, 2023, against Washington.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors began their five-game homestand (Dec. 28 - Jan. 5) with a 141-127 overtime win over the Golden State Warriors on Sunday afternoon. The win snaps a five-game home losing streak and marks the first overtime win of the season. Toronto will play the Orlando Magic tomorrow evening in the second game of a back-to-back. The Raptors have won three straight against the Magic.
- Scottie Barnes recorded a franchise-high tying 25 rebounds, tying Bismack Biyombo's previous record of 25 on Mar. 17, 2016 at Indiana. His 25 rebounds also mark the most rebounds by any player in the NBA has recorded this season. Barnes added 23 points and 10 assists for his first triple-double of the season and seventh of his career which is the most by a Raptor 24-years or younger.
- Barnes is the third Raptor to record a 20+ point and 20+ rebound game, joining Chris Bosh (twice) and Popeye Jones and is the only Raptor to record 20+ points and 20+ rebounds in a triple-double game.
- Barnes is the ninth player in NBA history (including playoffs) with a 23-point, 25-rebound, 10-assist game joining Wilt Chamberlain (18X), Elgin Baylor (2X), Maurice Stokes, Bob Pettit, Bill Russell, Billy Cunningham, Maurice Lucas and Nikola Jokic did it once. And now, Scottie.
- RJ Barrett returned to the lineup after missing 15 games due to a right knee sprain. He finished with 12 points, seven rebounds and four assists in 24 minutes of action.
- Ja'Kobe Walter led Raptors reserves with a season-high 18 points on 6-for-10 shooting and has now led bench points for the seventh time this year. Walter has scored 15+ points in consecutive games for the third time in his career.
- The Raptors shot 50.9% (56-for-110), improving to 10-1 when shooting 50%+ from the field this season.

**WARRIORS NOTES**

- The Golden State Warriors were outscored 19-to-5 in overtime, falling 141-127 to the Toronto Raptors at Scotiabank Arena Sunday evening in the first game of a three-game road trip (Dec. 28-31). The Warriors have now dropped five of their previous seven matchups against the Raptors on the road. Golden State will travel to Brooklyn for the second game of a back-to-back set. The Warriors are now 4-3 in the first game of their back-to-back sets so far this season.
- Steph Curry led all scorers with 39 points (12-30 FG, 4-11 3PT) in what was just his fourth loss in Toronto in his career (including the NBA playoffs). He has now recorded 109 three-point field goals this season, which is third overall in the NBA. Curry has recorded 35+ points in eight of 23 games played this season and is now 21 points shy of tying Kevin Garnett (26,071) for 21st on the NBA all-time points scored list.
- Draymond Green scored a season-high 21 points (8-14 FG, 4-8 3PT) and dished out a team-high seven assists in 33 minutes of action. His four three-point field goals are his second-most in a game this season after knocking down five three-point field goals on Nov. 7 at Denver.
- Jimmy Butler III recorded 19 points, six rebounds, and five assists in 38 minutes of action tonight. Butler went seven-for-seven from the free throw line, marking his eighth game shooting 1.000 from the free throw line this season.
- Brandin Podziemski and Will Richard combined to score 23 of Golden State's 37 bench points. Podziemski has now scored in double-digits in eight of his last nine games.
