KEY STATS

The Toronto Raptors overcame a 21-point deficit – their largest comeback of the season – and held the Orlando Magic to 12 points in the fourth quarter, tied for the second-fewest points a team has scored in the fourth this season.

Led by Jamal Shead's career high 19 points, Raptors reserves outscored the Magic bench with a season-high 50 points to their 19 (+31), their second-largest margin this season.

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors overcame a season-high tying 12-point fourth quarter deficit in consecutive for the first time in franchise history and have won back-to-back games for the first time since Nov. 23-24 which were also at Scotiabank Arena. The Raptors' 21-point deficit is their largest comeback win since Jan. 21, 2025 vs Orlando and is tied for their fifth-largest comeback win at home all-time. Toronto extends their winning streak against Orlando to four consecutive games including two at home.
- The Raptors will continue their season-high tying five-game homestand on Wednesday night to close out the 2025 calendar year against the Denver Nuggets. Toronto will play Atlanta in consecutive games (Jan. 3-5) to kick off 2026.
- Five Raptors recorded 5+ rebounds as Toronto recorded a season-high 58 rebounds. The Raptors have recorded 55+ rebounds in consecutive games (Dec. 28-29) for the fourth time in franchise history and first time since Mar. 24-26, 2025. Toronto joins the San Antonio Spurs and the Detroit Pistons as the only teams to do so this season.
- Scottie Barnes recorded 13 points and 11 rebounds for his team-leading 16th double-double of the season. His 36 rebounds over a two-game span is the most by a Raptor since Bismack Biyombo did the same Mar. 17-18, 2016.
- Raptors rookie Collin Murray-Boyles, who missed the two previous games due to an illness, returned to the line up and grabbed a career-high tying 12 rebounds and finished with a game-high +18 from the floor.
- Jamal Shead led all Raptors with a career-high 19 points in 29 minutes off the bench. Gradey Dick added 15 points, all of which came in the first half, and Ja'Kobe Walter poured in 10 points as Toronto's bench outscored the Magic reserves 50-to-19 (+31). The 50 points mark a season-high for the Raptors bench.
- Mo Bamba made his Raptors debut tonight after signing earlier in the day. He finished with one block in four minutes off the bench. Bamba was picked sixth overall by the Magic in the 2018 NBA Draft.

MAGIC NOTES

- The Orlando Magic gave up a 21-point lead in the first half, falling to the Toronto Raptors 107-106 in the second game of a back-to-back set Monday night at Scotiabank Arena. They have now dropped four straight against Toronto, which is tied for their fourth-longest losing streak against the Raptors in franchise history. The Magic will continue their three-game road trip (Dec. 29 – Jan. 2) into the New Year with a matchup in Indiana on Dec. 31. Orlando now stands at a 7-9 record on the road – they have finished above .500 on the road just five times in franchise history.
- Paolo Banchero was just the second player to record a triple-double against the Raptors this season, securing his fourth career triple double with 23 points, 15 rebounds, and ten assists. His four triple-doubles rank second on the all-time Orlando Magic franchise history list – just behind Elfrid Payton (8).
- Anthony Black led Magic scorers with a game-high 27 points after recording a career-high 38 points against Denver last night. Black has led or tied in scoring for the Magic four times this season, recording 20+ points in ten games.
- Desmond Bane scored all 18 of his points in the first half of the game, adding six rebounds, three assists, and one block in 30 minutes of action. This marks Bane's 27th double-digit scoring game this season.
