KEY STAT

The Toronto Raptors outscored the Atlanta Hawks in points in the paint (64-to-44) and fastbreak points (29-to-16). Toronto continues to be the leading team in the NBA in fastbreak points scored per game (19.3).

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors have swept the Atlanta Hawks (4-0) in the season series for the first time since the 2019-20 season (3-0). With the win tonight, the Raptors completed their season-long tying five-game homestand (Dec. 28 – Jan. 5) at 4-1. Toronto will play the first game of a two-game road trip (Jan. 7-9) in Charlotte on Wednesday.
- The Raptors shot 50%+ in three of four games against Atlanta this season. Toronto has now shot 50%+ in 13 games this season improving to 13-1 in those contests. The Raptors also improve to 3-0 when keeping opponents under 40% shooting and 15-2 when keeping opponents under 44% from the field this season.
- Four players recorded multiple steals tonight as the Raptors finished with 10. Toronto improves to 11-4 when recording 10-or-more steals this season. All five starters scored 15+ points tonight improving to 2-0 when doing so (last: Nov. 19 vs. Philadelphia). Brandon Ingram led all players with 19 points and a season-high tying nine rebounds.
- Scottie Barnes added 18 points and 10 assists for his team-leading 20th double-double of the season. Tonight marks his third point-assist double-double of the season – the previous two times were part of a triple-double performance.
- Collin Murray-Boyles made his sixth career start and finished with 17 points, seven rebounds, a career-high seven assists and added three steals and two blocks. He finished a game-high +24 from the field in 31 minutes of action. Murray-Boyles is the second Raptors rookie ever to record a 15/5/5 game with three steals and two blocks joining Vince Carter. He also joins Cooper Flagg as the only other rookie to do so in the NBA. Murray-Boyles 17 points are the most since he scored 19 points off the bench Oct. 27 at San Antonio in his second career game. His five stocks (blocks and steals) are also the most in a single-game.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili has scored 10+ points in six of his last seven games (Dec. 23 – Jan. 5). He leads the team with 16 games of 10+ points off the bench and is fourth on the team in total double digit point games this season with 23 such contests.

HAWKS NOTES

- The Atlanta Hawks drop Monday night's matchup against the Toronto Raptors at Scotiabank Arena in the fourth and final matchup of a four-game season series, going 0-4 in a season sweep by Toronto. They have now lost six straight against the Raptors, matching their second-longest losing streak against the Raptors in franchise history. Atlanta will return home for a brief matchup against the New Orleans Pelicans on Jan. 7 before embarking on a four-game road trip (Jan. 9 – 15).
- All five Hawks starters scored in double-digits, led by Onyeka Okongwu's 17 points (7-13 FG). Okongwu grabbed 12 rebounds for his ninth double-double of the season. Zaccharie Risacher scored 16 points before fouling out in the fourth quarter of the game.
- Jalen Johnson secured his 25th double-double of the season with 13 points, a game-high 14 rebounds, and seven assists, marking the most double-doubles recorded by an Eastern Conference player this season and the second-most amongst all players in the NBA – just behind Nikola Jokic (28).
- Canadian Nickeil Alexander-Walker added 14 points, five rebounds, and four assists – he is now one assist shy of dishing out 1000 career dimes.
- Returning reserves: Luke Kennard returned after missing Saturday night's matchup in Toronto due to back soreness. Kennard scored 10 points off the bench, knocking down three of his four three-point field goals. Heading into play, Kennard held the NBA's highest active three-point field goal percentage among players that qualify (.438). Porzingis returned after missing 11 games due to illness. He recorded nine points in 20 minutes tonight.
- Vit Krejci added 10 points (3-6 FG, 2-5 3PT) in 27 minutes off the bench tonight and has now made 92 three-point field goals this season, the most he has recorded in a single season during his career.
