TEAM NOTES

- The **Toronto Raptors** are in Boston to complete their two-game road trip (Jan. 7-9) before returning home for back-to-back contests (Jan. 11-12) against the Philadelphia 76ers. Friday's contest marks the third game of a four-game season series against the Celtics. The Celtics and Raptors enter play as the third and fourth seed in the East respectively.
- The Raptors have won three consecutive games and are winners of five of their last six contests (Dec. 28 - Jan. 7) after overcoming a 13-point deficit against the Charlotte Hornets on Wednesday. The Raptors have recorded nine double-digit comeback victories this season.
- RJ Barrett** led all players with 28 points on Wednesday. He scored 16 points in the fourth quarter matching a career-high for points scored in a final frame. He enters play having scored 20+ points in seven straight games vs. Boston and is averaging a career 21.2 points against the Celtics.
- Raptors rookie **Collin Murray-Boyles** recorded a career-high 15 rebounds for his third double digit rebound game which is third-most on the team. His 15 rebounds are the most by a Raptors rookie since Scottie Barnes recorded 17 on Mar. 18, 2022 against the Lakers. Murray-Boyles has also totalled 35 offensive rebounds since Dec. 20 which is fifth-most in the NBA in that span.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili** scored 10 points Wednesday to lead bench scoring for a team-leading 13th time this season. He is averaging 19.0 points and shooting a team-high 65.2% (15-23) from the field including 63.6% (7-11) from three in the two games against Boston this season.
- The Raptors announced Thursday that **Chucky Hepburn** underwent successful surgery to repair a tear in the meniscus of his right knee. He will be reevaluated in six weeks. Hepburn has appeared in two games for the Raptors this season and 18 games (all starts) for Raptors 905.

- Has scored 15+ pts in four straight including 25+ twice while averaging 22.8 points and shooting 50%.
- Missed first two games vs. Boston due to a right knee sprain; Averaging career 21.2 points vs. Celtics.

F - SCOTTIE BARNES #4 MIN: 34.0 REB: 8.4 AST: 5.2 STL: 1.34 TO: 2.6 BLK: 1.47 PTS: 19.1

- Jan. 7 at Charlotte: 17 points, four rebounds, one steal and one block in 29 minutes.
- One of only three players to total 700+ points, 300+ rebounds and 150+ assists this season.
- Only player this season to record 50+ blocks and 50+ steals; Leads league with 107 stocks.

C - COLLIN MURRAY-BOYLES #12 MIN: 19.6 REB: 4.6 AST: 1.7 STL: 0.77 TO: 1.1 BLK: 0.55 PTS: 7.1

- Jan. 7 at Charlotte: Four points, career-high 15 rebounds, three assists and one steal in 32 minutes.
- Became the eighth Raptors rookie to record three games of 12+ rebounds in a single-season.
- Since Dec. 23, ranks first in offensive rebounds, fourth in total rebounds and fourth in stocks among rookies.

G - OCHAI AGBAJI #30 MIN: 15.8 REB: 2.3 AST: 0.8 STL: 0.47 TO: 0.3 BLK: 0.20 PTS: 4.2

- Jan. 7 at Charlotte: Two points and four rebounds in 12 minutes off the bench.
- Averaging 8.5 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.0 block in two games vs. Boston this season.
- Averaging 6.0 points, 3.1 rebounds, 1.0 assist and 20.8 minutes in 11 starts this season.

- Jan. 7 at Charlotte: 21 points, four rebounds, three assists and one steal in 33 minutes.

CHARLOTTE — Immanuel Quickley hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key at the buzzer and the Toronto Raptors rallied from a 10-point deficit in the fourth quarter to beat the Charlotte Hornets 97-96 on Wednesday night ... RJ Barrett finished with 28 points and seven rebounds, while Quickley added 21 points ... Scottie Barnes chipped in with 17 points as the Raptors won for the fifth time in six games ... Collin Sexton led the Hornets with 22 points ... Charlotte had 18 turnovers to Toronto's six ... Charlotte took a 50-45 lead into the locker room at halftime behind 11 points from Kon Knueppel, who had a rare off night shooting finishing 4 of 17 from the field and 3 of 11 from 3-point range ... The Hornets pushed the lead to 10 early in the fourth quarter after Moussa Diabate stole a pass at midcourt and drove the floor scoring on a spinning layup ... But the Raptors, who shot 3 of 27 from beyond the arc in the first three quarters, clawed back with Barrett giving his team the lead on a 3-pointer with 5:40 left ... Toronto was 4 of 7 from 3-point distance in the fourth quarter.

Murray-Boyles added seven rebounds and seven assists for Toronto (22-15) in place of injured starter Jakob Poeltl (back strain) ... Raptors coach Darco Rajakovic confirmed before that game that Poeltl had been cleared for contact ... Scottie Barnes finished with 18 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds as the Raptors beat the Hawks for the second straight game ... Toronto defeated Atlanta 134-117 on Saturday ... Brandon Ingram had 19 points and nine rebounds as seven Toronto players reached double digits in scoring ... Jalen Johnson had 13 points and 14 rebounds and Onyeka Okongwu finished with 17 points and 12 rebounds for Atlanta (17-21) ... Kristaps Porzingis returned to the Hawks' lineup, after missing the second game of a back-to-back, scoring nine points in 20 minutes off the bench ... ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES ...

- The Raptors scored 141 points Dec. 28 vs. Golden State which is the fourth-most points in franchise history in a regular season game and the second-most ever scored at home.
- Scottie Barnes recorded 23 points, 25 rebounds and 10 assists Dec. 28 vs. Golden State to become the first Raptor to record a 20+ point and 20+ rebound triple-double. The 25 rebounds tied a single-game franchise record for total rebounds in a game.
- Won nine straight games (Nov. 11-26) which tied the fourth-longest winning streak in Raptors franchise history.
- Set a franchise record in points scored in a third quarter with 48 points on Nov. 21 vs. Washington.
- Set a franchise record by shooting 50%+ from the field in five consecutive games (Nov. 13-21).
- Maple Leafs Sports and Entertainment further extended the contract of Raptors General Bobby Webster on Aug. 18.
- The Raptors signed centre Jakob Poeltl to a multi-year contract extension on Jul. 8. Poeltl averaged career highs of 14.5 points, 9.6 rebounds and 29.6 minutes in 57 games (56 starts) last season. He ranked fifth in the NBA with a .627 (363-579) field goal percentage, his eighth consecutive season shooting better than 60 percent from the floor.
- Toronto selected forward Collin Murray-Boyles with the ninth overall pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft. DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ

HEAD COACH

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007)

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their son, Luka.
