KEY STAT

The Philadelphia 76ers shot 44.4 percent from the three-point field goal line compared to the Toronto Raptors shooting 16.2 percent from beyond the arc.

RAPTORS NOTES

- Toronto fell to the Philadelphia snapping a three-game home winning streak against the 76ers. The Raptors and 76ers have tied the season series 2-2 for the first time since the 2010-11 campaign. The Raptors travel to Indiana to play the Pacers on Wednesday before returning home to host the Los Angeles Clippers on Friday.
- Halfway through the regular season the Raptors are 24-17 overall. Through 41 games last season, the Raptors spotted a 10-31 record.
- Brandon Ingram returned to the starting lineup after missing two games (Jan. 9-11) due to a right thumb sprain – the first two games missed this season. Ingram finished with 15 points, season-high 10 rebounds and seven assists in 34 minutes of play. Tonight marks his first double-double since Jan. 31, 2024 at Houston (24 points, 10 rebounds).
- AJ Lawson led all reserves with a season-high 14 points (5-9 FG, 3-6 3PT) in 17 minutes off the bench. It marks his second double digit point game of the season and most points scored since Apr. 13, 2025 at San Antonio where he also scored 14 points. Lawson is averaging 22.2 points, 5.1 rebounds, 1.8 assists, 1.7 steals and 31.3 minutes in 17 (all starts) Regular Season and Tip-Off Tournament games with Raptors 905 this season.
- The Raptors bench outscored the 76ers bench 37-to-21 (+16).
- Raptors rookie Collin Murray-Boyles finished with 12 points, seven rebounds, six assists and two steals in his sixth consecutive start. Murray-Boyles has recorded a team-high 46 rebounds including 20 offensive rebounds in his last five games. Scottie Barnes is second in total rebounds (23) in that span.
- The NBA announced Monday that Scottie Barnes has been named Eastern Conference Player of the Week for Week 12 of the 2025-26 season (Jan. 5-11), capturing the honour for the second time in his career. Barnes helped the Raptors to a 3-1 record last week, averaging a team-high 22.0 points, 6.3 rebounds, 6.0 assists and 36.4 minutes.

76ERS NOTES

- The Philadelphia 76ers defeated the Toronto Raptors 115-102 Monday night at Scotiabank Arena after leading by as many as 33 points in the second game of a back-to-back set in Toronto, completing the four-game season series with a 2-2 record. The 76ers scored 45 points in the first quarter – which is tied for their most in any quarter this season – by halftime, Philadelphia had notched 80 points – their highest in any half played this year. Philadelphia will now return home for a six-game homestand (Jan. 14-24).
- Tyrese Maxey scored 18 of his game-high 33 points in the first quarter for his tenth 15-point quarter of the season, tied for 4th in the NBA. Maxey now has eight career games with 30+ points against the Raptors, which marks the most number of games with 30+ he has scored against any opponent in his career. Maxey also recorded six three-point field goals tonight (tied for his second-most this season) and moves to 135 three-point field goals this season. He holds 831 on his career and is now 54 triples away from tying Allen Iverson for most all-time in 76ers franchise history.
- Joel Embiid made his return after missing last night's matchup against Toronto and finished with 27 points, eight rebounds, four assists, and two steals. Embiid is now three points away from reaching the 13,000 career points milestone. He currently stands at seventh overall on the all-time 76ers points list in franchise history.
- Kyle Lowry checked in late during the fourth quarter for a standing ovation from the Raptors crowd. Lowry spent nine seasons with the Toronto Raptors (2012-21) where he won an NBA Championship (2018-19). Lowry is the Raptors' all-time assists leader (4,277), three-point field goals (1,518), steals (873), and triple-doubles (16).
