**KEY STAT**

The Los Angeles Clippers held the Toronto Raptors to just eight points over the final eight minutes of play – scoring 20 points to force overtime and secure the 121-117 victory. This marks the second time this season that Los Angeles has won after trailing following three quarters of play.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- Toronto fell to the Los Angeles Clippers on Friday night and are now 2-2 in overtime this season including 1-1 against Western Conference teams. The Raptors begin their season-high tying five-game road trip (Jan. 18-23) on Sunday against the Lakers which mark the second game of six consecutive games against Western Conference opponents.
- Scottie Barnes finished with a team-high 24 points. He scored all eight points for Toronto in overtime. Barnes has scored 20+ points in three of his last five games against the Clippers. He enters Sunday's game against Los Angeles having scored 20+ in three straight and in five of six career games against the Lakers.
- Jamal Shread scored 10 of his 15 points in the first half – scoring 10+ points in a half for the 10th time in his career. Shread also recorded a career-high 13 assists on Friday which ties for the most by any Raptor this season joining Scottie Barnes and Immanuel Quickley. Shread's fourth game of 10+ assists also ties Barnes and Quickley for most such games this season. He is the first Raptors sophomore to do so since Scottie recorded four in 2022-23.
- Shread has now recorded 5+ assists in a career-high seven straight games (Jan. 5-16). Entering play, Shread ranked in the top 20 in the NBA in total assists and first among sophomores this season.
- Ochai Agbaji made his first start since Dec. 31 and recorded season highs of 15 points and three three-point field goals tonight. He has scored double digit points in consecutive games for the second time this season and marks his first 15-point game since Apr. 11, 2025 at Dallas. He now has 15+ points in 30 career games.
- Gradey Dick led the Raptors bench with 15 points in 27 minutes off the bench. He has scored 15+ points in consecutive games (Jan. 14-16) for the first time since Jan. 23, 2025. His three 3PT field goals tied a season-high.
- Collin Murray-Boyles has recorded at least one block or one steal in 11 consecutive games (Dec. 23 – Jan. 16). He entered play as one of three rookies this season with 30+ steals and 20+ blocks. Murray-Boyles has scored 10+ points in a career-high four consecutive games (Jan. 11-16).

**CLIPPERS NOTES**

- The Los Angeles Clippers took the first of a two-game season series 121-117 in an overtime thriller against the Toronto Raptors on a Friday night showdown at Scotiabank Arena. Last season, Los Angeles split the two-game series 1-1. Down four players – including former Raptor Kawhi Leonard, the Clippers went on a 20-8 run over the last 8:17 to extend their win streak to five straight – their second-longest winning streak this season. They previously won six consecutive games from Dec. 20 – Jan. 1. They will continue their three-game road trip (Jan. 16-20) with a game in Washington on Monday.
- James Harden scored 16 of the Clipper's last 20 points over that run to seal the game – finishing with a game-high 31 points (10-27 FG) and dished out a team-high ten assists for his 12<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season. Entering play, Harden was averaging 25.6 points this season, his highest points per game since 2019-20 when he lead the league in scoring (34.3 ppg) and was ranked sixth overall in assists per game (8.0).
- Jordan Miller led bench scorers with 19 points (8-11 FG, 3-5 3PT) for his fourth double-digit game in four of his last five games. He also added career-highs of six assists and four steals tonight.
- With his 505<sup>th</sup> appearance as a Clipper, Ivica Zubac surpassed Blake Griffin for sole possession of sixth place on the Clippers' all-time games played list. Zubac finished with 16 points and a game-high 14 rebounds for his 19<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season. Entering play, Zubac was tied for fourth in rebounds per game (10.7), seventh in field goal percentage (.606) and tied for eighth in double-doubles (18).
