TEAM NOTES

- The **Toronto Raptors** travel to Chase Center to take on the Golden State Warriors Tuesday night in the second game of a season-long tying five-game road trip (Jan. 18-25). Toronto hosted the Warriors at the end of December, winning their first matchup 141-127 in overtime, marking a season-high in points scored this season. The Raptors look to sweep the season series Tuesday for the first time since the 2019-20 NBA season.
- Toronto fell to the Los Angeles Lakers Sunday night - dropping the two-game season series. The Raptors have now lost seven straight against Los Angeles, marking their longest losing streak against the Lakers in franchise history and have not secured a victory on the road in Los Angeles since Mar. 14, 2022. The Lakers recorded 14 three-point field goals compared to the Raptors' seven such field goals made.
- Scottie Barnes** led Raptors scorers for the 12th time this season, which is tied for second-most on the team, just behind **Brandon Ingram** - who has led in scoring 20 times. Ingram added 19 points, a team-high tying seven assists, six rebounds, three steals, and a block in 34 minutes.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili** led Raptors reserves for the 15th time this year, recording 20 points, six rebounds, two assists, a steal, and a block in 24 minutes off the bench. Mamukelashvili has recorded 20+ points three times this season and his 12 points scored in the first quarter mark a season-high for points scored in a single quarter this season. His two three-point field goals notched 50 total on the season and his six rebounds bring him to 203 on the season.
- Rookie **Collin Murray-Boyles** recorded 11 points, seven rebounds, five assists, and three blocks for his fifth straight game with 10+ points, extending a career-high streak.

- Jan. 18 at Lakers: Team-high 22 points, nine rebounds, three assists, and a steal in 35 minutes of action.
- Has scored 20+ points in four straight games and in five of nine career games against the Warriors.
- Only player in the NBA with 800+ points, 300+ rebounds and 50+ blocks this season.

C - SANDRO MAMUKELASHVILI #54 MIN: 21.4 REB: 4.8 AST: 1.9 STL: 0.67 TO: 0.8 BLK: 0.60 PTS: 10.6

- Jan. 18 at Lakers: 20 points, six rebounds, two assists, a steal, and a block in 24 minutes off the bench.
- Has recorded 20+ points three times this year and in eight games in his NBA career.
- Averaging 15.3 points, 6.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 29.7 minutes in eight starts with Toronto this year.

G - OCHAI AGBAJI #30 MIN: 16.4 REB: 2.4 AST: 0.8 STL: 0.43 TO: 0.4 BLK: 0.26 PTS: 4.5

- Jan. 18 at Lakers: Finished with three, rebounds, one assist and +3 in 25 minutes.
- Has scored 10+ points in straight games for two times this season; Has scored 15+ in 30 career games.
- Averaging 6.2 points, 3.1 rebounds, 1.0 assist and 22.3 minutes in 13 starts this season.

G - IMMANUEL QUICKLEY #5 MIN: 32.4 REB: 4.2 AST: 6.1 STL: 1.15 TO: 1.7 BLK: 0.12 PTS: 16.3

- Jan. 18 at Lakers: Nine points, team-high tying seven assists, three rebounds, and one steal in 29 minutes.

LOS ANGELES — Luka Doncic had 25 points and seven assists, LeBron James added 24 points and seven assists, and the Los Angeles Lakers returned to form with a 110-93 victory over the Toronto Raptors on Sunday night ... Deandre Ayton had 25 points and 13 rebounds in his impressive return from a knee injury for the Lakers, who won for just the second time in seven games while playing their final home game before an eight-game, 15-day road trip ... Doncic also returned with a strong performance after missing Saturday's loss at Portland to rest his nagging injuries, hitting five 3-pointers ... Scottie Barnes had 22 points and nine rebounds for the Raptors, who have lost back-to-back games for the first time in four weeks after the Clippers beat them in Toronto on Friday ... Sandro Mamukelashvili scored 20 points and former Lakers draft pick Brandon Ingram added 19 points and seven assists for Toronto, which faded in the fourth quarter in the opener of a five-game road trip ... Neither team managed a double-digit lead until the Lakers surged ahead 91-80 on back-to-back buckets by James to begin the fourth quarter ... Los Angeles took control shortly with nine points while holding Toronto scoreless for 3 1/2 minutes.

TORONTO — Scottie Barnes scored 23 points, matched a Raptors franchise record with a career-high 25 rebounds and added 10 assists for his seventh career triple-double as Toronto beat the Golden State Warriors 141-127 in overtime on Sunday ... Immanuel Quickley scored 27 points, Brandon Ingram had 26 and Ja'Kobe Walter added a season-high 18 for the Raptors, who snapped a five-game home losing streak ... Stephen Curry scored 14 of his 39 points in the third quarter but didn't score in overtime ... Draymond Green had 21 and Jimmy Butler added 19 but it wasn't enough for the Warriors ... Barnes matched Bismack Biyombo's 2016 franchise record for rebounds in a game ... Raptors forward RJ Barrett returned from a 15-game absence to score 12 points in 24 minutes ... Toronto scored 35 points off 21 Golden State turnovers, the most by a Warriors opponent this season ... Brandin Podziemski scored 13 points and Will Richard added 10 as Golden State fell to 6-12 on the road. Sandro Mamukelashvili scored 13 points for Toronto and Ochai Agbaji had 10 as seven players scored in double digits.

The 35-year-old DeRozan has scored at least 20 points in each of his first eight games with the Kings, breaking a franchise mark established by Chris Webber when he reached 20 in his first seven games with Sacramento in 1999 ... DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ **HEAD COACH**

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007)

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their son, Luka.
