The New York Knicks outscored the Toronto Raptors 60-to-38 in points in the paint – Toronto had previously been ranked eighth in the NBA in points in the paint per game (52.6).

RAPTORS NOTES

- Toronto fell to the New York Knicks snapping a four-game winning streak and have now lost three straight games at home. The Raptors will play their final game of January on Friday on the road against the Orlando Magic. Toronto will then return to Scotiabank Arena to begin a five-game homestand on Sunday leading up to the All-Star break.
- Collin Murray-Boyles returned to the starting lineup after missing four games due to a left thumb contusion and finished with four points, five rebounds, five assists and a career-high four blocks. The NBA announced Monday that Murray-Boyles has been selected to participate in the Castrol Rising Stars showcase as part of NBA All-Star 2026.
- Brandon Ingram scored a team-high 27 points (10-16 FG) and has now scored 20+ points in four of his last five games (Jan. 20-28) and in 30 of 47 games played this season. Ingram is averaging 24.0 points while shooting 55.6% in three games against New York this season. He reached 1,000 points tonight in his 47th game in a Toronto uniform becoming the third-fastest Raptor to do so behind Kawhi Leonard (37 games) and RJ Barrett (45 games).
- Scottie Barnes recorded 17 points and a team-high 10 rebounds for his 22nd double-double of the season and his first double-double against the Knicks since his debut vs. New York on Dec. 10, 2021, at home. He is one double-double shy of tying Pascal Siakam (102) for fifth-most double-doubles in franchise history.
- Grady Dick led all reserves with 11 points in 16 minutes off the bench. Dick has now scored double digit points in a season-high five consecutive games (Jan. 20-28) averaging 10.4 points, while shooting 48.6% from the field.

KNICKS NOTES

- In an Atlantic Division battle, the New York Knicks overcame a 12-point deficit – outscoring the Raptors 72-to-41 in the second half – and sealed their third victory of the season against the Toronto Raptors on Wednesday night at Scotiabank Arena. New York is now 24-1 when leading after three quarters this season. They have also won a franchise-best 11 consecutive games against the Raptors. The Knicks will face Toronto two more times – a total of five matchups this season due to their NBA Cup Quarterfinal matchup on Dec. 9. New York extends their current winning streak to four straight – returning home for a two-game homestand against the Portland Trail Blazers and LA Lakers. The Knicks are now first in the Atlantic Division and are 8-3 against their division rivals.
- Mikal Bridges scored 19 of his game-leading 30 points in the third quarter, powering the Knicks' 35 points in those 12 minutes – it also marks a season-high for points scored in any quarter for Bridges this season. This is the second time Bridges has recorded 30+ points this season.
- Karl-Anthony Towns dominated the glass with 22 rebounds for his second game with 20+ rebounds this season and for the 21st time in his NBA career, which ranks seventh among active NBA players for most such games – he is now one game away from tying Nikola Jokic for sixth. Towns is the second player to have a 20-rebound game against the Raptors this season and recorded a 20-rebound game against Toronto last season on Feb. 4, 2025.
- OG Anunoby tied his season-high with 26 points and a season-high of six steals. He has now surpassed 700 career steals. His 26-point performance is his third-best performance against Toronto. He is averaging 20.8 points against the Raptors and is now 6-0 against his former team.
- Josh Hart added 22 points and six assists, recorded two steals to surpass 600 career steals.
- Tyler Kolek dished out a game-high ten assists – just one shy of tying his season-high.
