**KEY STAT**

The Toronto Raptors outscored the Utah Jazz 19-to-7 in fastbreak points tonight – entering play, the Raptors lead the league in fast break points per game (19.3).

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors snapped a three-game losing streak at home, recording their 30<sup>th</sup> win of the season in game 51 after finishing the 2024-25 NBA season 30-52. With a victory against the Utah Jazz at Scotiabank Arena Sunday evening, Toronto has now won three straight against the Jazz and will look to sweep the season series on Mar. 23 in Utah – looking for their first consecutive seasons of sweeping the Jazz since 2018-20. This marked the first game of a season-long tying five-game homestand ahead of the All-Star break. The Raptors will next face Minnesota Timberwolves on Feb. 4 in the first game of a back-to-back set this week. Toronto holds a winning record in their only other five-game homestand played this season (4-1 from Dec. 28 – Jan. 5).
- RJ Barrett led Raptors scorers for the 13<sup>th</sup> time this season, tying Scottie Barnes for second-most team-leading scoring performances this season. This also marked his 67<sup>th</sup> career game with 20+ points as a Raptors, surpassing Doug Christie for 13<sup>th</sup> on the all-time list in franchise history. Barrett added six rebounds and four assists – and has now dished out 100+ assists this season for the eighth time in his NBA career. Last season, Barrett dished out a career-high 314 dimes.
- Scottie Barnes added 14 points, a team-high nine rebounds, four assists, four blocks, and two steals. Earlier tonight, Barnes was named a reserve for the 2026 NBA All-Star Game. This is his second All-Star selection after he was an injury replacement in 2024 and he becomes the sixth player in franchise history to earn multiple All-Star selections, joining Chris Bosh, Vince Carter, DeMar DeRozan, Kyle Lowry and Pascal Siakam.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili led Raptors reserves with 20 points, six rebounds, and a steal. Mamukelashvili has led the bench in a team-high 17 games this season. This marks his sixth game with 20+ points this season and the third time he has recorded 20+ as a reserve. His four three-point field goals also bring him to 65 this season – a career-best in a single season.

**JAZZ NOTES**

- The Utah Jazz fell to the Toronto Raptors and have now lost six straight games and 10 of their last 11 (Jan. 14 – Feb. 1). The Jazz will continue their five-game road trip (Feb. 1-9) on Tuesday in Indiana.
- The Jazz recorded 56 rebounds and finished with a +14 (56-to-42) advantage in boards tonight. Utah has now recorded 50+ rebounds 11 times this season but fall to 6-5 in those contests.
- Lauri Markkanen returned to the lineup after missing the last game due to rest and scored a team-high 27 points and added 11 rebounds for his fifth double-double of the season. He has now scored 20+ points in 12 of his last 14 games (Dec. 12 – Feb. 1) and in 29 of 36 games played this season. Markkanen is averaging a career-high 27.4 points per game which is eighth-best in the league.
- Isaiah Collier made his first start since Jan. 27 and scored a season-high 19 points (5-8 FG, 8-10 FT). Collier has now scored 10+ points in season-best five straight games (Jan. 24 – Feb. 1) matching the second-longest such streak of his career. He also finished with game-high seven assists. His 6.7 assists per game is second among sophomores.
- Jusuf Nurkic returned to the lineup after missing the last game due to illness and scored 10 points and added 11 rebounds for his team-leading 15<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season. Entering play, he had 21 games of 10+ rebounds which was ninth-best in the league while his 10.1 rebounds per game was ranked top-15 in the NBA.
- Jazz rookie Ace Bailey recorded a career-high 11 rebounds and added four points, two assists one steal and one block in 27 minutes of action. Bailey, who was drafted fifth overall in the 2025 NBA draft, ranks top-10 in points, steals, blocks and minutes among rookies this season.
