KEY STAT

The Minnesota Timberwolves outscored the Toronto Raptors 34-to-22 in the fourth quarter after previously allowing 30+ points in eight consecutive quarters.

RAPTORS NOTES

- Despite leading by as many as 18 points, the Toronto Raptors dropped their second game of a season-tying five-game homestand to the Minnesota Timberwolves Wednesday night at Scotiabank Arena – breaking a four-game winning streak at home against the Timberwolves – and having previously won 20 straight against the Wolves at Scotiabank Arena in Toronto – dating back to 2004. Toronto now holds a 5-5 record in the first game of their back-to-back sets this season. Last year, they went 3-12 in such games. The Raptors will face the Bulls tomorrow night in the second game of their tenth back-to-back set of the season.
- Brandon Ingram led Raptors scorers for the 24th time this season – he leads the team with most such games. Ingram poured in 25 points, six rebounds, four assists, and a block in 35 minutes of play.
- Immanuel Quickley recorded 23 points, including six three-point field goals for his seventh game with 5+ three-point field goals this season and his 16th such game as a Raptor, tying OG Anunoby for 7th on the franchise list. His game-high tying eight assists also brought him to over 1,500 career assists. Quickley has led the Raptors in total assists this season.
- With 22 points, ten rebounds, eight assists, one steal, and one blocks - Scottie Barnes recorded a team-leading 23rd double-double tonight, tying former Raptor Pascal Siakam for fifth on Toronto's all-time double-doubles list with 102.
- The NBA announced Tuesday that Toronto Raptors head coach Darko Rajaković has been named by Commissioner Adam Silver as the coach for the World Team at the 2026 NBA All-Star Game, set for Sunday, Feb. 15 at Intuit Dome in Inglewood, California. Rajaković will be the third coach in franchise history to participate in the All-Star game, joining Dwane Casey (2018) and Nick Nurse (2020). Rajaković will take part in his second All-Star weekend after he was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the 2014 NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

TIMBERWOLVES NOTES

- The Minnesota Timberwolves snapped a 20-game losing streak in Toronto winning for the first time since 2004. The Timberwolves have won five of their last six games (Jan. 26 – Feb. 2).
- The Timberwolves will head back home to start a six-game homestand (Feb. 6-22) – that includes the All-Star break – starting with the New Orleans Pelicans on Friday.
- Anthony Edwards scored a game-high 30 points and added eight rebounds, five assists, three steals and one block in 38 minutes of play. Edwards, who has scored 30+ points in three straight games (Jan. 31 – Feb. 4) entered played ranked third in the league in scoring average. The NBA announced that Edwards was selected as a Western Conference reserve.
- Rudy Gobert finished with 10 points and a game-high 12 rebounds for his team-leading 23rd double-double of the season which is top-10 in the NBA. Gobert ranked second in the NBA in rebounds entering tonight.
- The Timberwolves shot 50.5% (49-97) from the field improving to 16-2 when shooting 50%+ this season.
