The Toronto Raptors outscored the Indiana Pacers 44-to-26 (+18) in the third quarter as well as in points in the paint (64-46), second chance points (21-6), and fastbreak points (34-9).

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Indiana Pacers and swept the season series 4-0. It marks the first four-game season series sweep of the Pacers since the 2000-01 campaign. The Raptors will complete their five-game homestand (Feb. 1-11) on Wednesday against the Detroit Pistons ahead of the All-Star break.
- Toronto outrebounded Indiana 54-to-40 (+14) tonight led by Scottie Barnes (14) and Trayce Jackson-Davis who combined for 24 boards.
- Scottie Barnes finished with 25 points, 14 rebounds, six assists four blocks and steals in 33 minutes of action. He has now surpassed Pascal Siakam for fifth on Toronto's all-time double-doubles list with 103 and is just two double-doubles shy of tying his single-season record (26). Barnes has recorded his 17th game of 25/10/5 of his career which is second behind Pascal Siakam for the franchise record (32). Tonight marked his 10th game of 5+ stocks.
- Trayce Jackson-Davis made his Raptors debut on Sunday night and finished with 10 points and 10 rebounds in 15 minutes off the bench for his first double-double of the season. He led all players with eight offensive rebounds. Davis was acquired from the Golden State Warriors in exchange for a 2026 second round draft pick (via the LA Lakers).
- Jackson-Davis is the fifth player ever to record a double-double in a Raptors debut – the first since Kawhi Leonard (24 points and 12 rebounds) – and the first Raptor to record a double-double in his debut off the bench.
- RJ Barrett played in his 30th game of the season having missed 24 contests due to injuries. He finished with 20 points, eight rebounds, five assists and one steal in 32 minutes of action. Tonight marks his third 20/5/5 game of the season and first since Nov. 2, 2025 vs. Memphis. Barrett has scored 20+ points in two of his last three games.
- Sandro Mamukelashvili finished 17 points (6-9 FG) in 22 minutes off the bench. He has scored 10+ points in four straight games (Feb. 1-8) off the bench averaging 17.0 points while shooting 59.5% in those games. Mamukelashvili has led Raptors reserves in scoring 20 times this season.

PACERS NOTES

- The Indiana Pacers dropped their fourth straight loss to the Toronto Raptors and ultimately get swept in the season series following their final matchup of the season Sunday afternoon at Scotiabank Arena. Indiana moves to a 3-22 record on the road this season and have lost four consecutive games. They will continue their road trip with contests against the New York Knicks (Feb. 10) and the Brooklyn Nets (Feb. 11) in a back-to-back set ahead of the NBA All-Star break.
- Pascal Siakam led Indiana scorers with 18 points (7-15 FG), four rebounds, and two assists in 24 minutes of play. Heading into tonight, Siakam was ranked within the top 20 in points scored per game at 23.8. Last week, he earned his fourth NBA All-Star appearance and his second straight in a Pacers uniform as he was selected as an Eastern Conference reserve. His other two All-Star appearances came in a Raptors jersey.
- Jay Huff finished with 15 points and added seven rebounds to surpass 200 season rebounds. Huff recorded two blocks and is tied with Victor Wembanyama for most blocks in the NBA this season with 103.
- Pacing the bench: Jarace Walker (13), Ben Sheppard (12), and T.J. McConnell (10) all scored in double-digits off the bench to power 35 of the Pacer's 50 reserve scoring.
- Andrew Nembhard added ten points in front of his hometown Canadian crowd, adding three rebounds, two assists, and two steals.
