**KEY STAT**

The Detroit Pistons outscored the Toronto Raptors 50-to-34 in points in the paint and have marked their 96th consecutive game with at least 40 points in the paint – this is the longest streak by any NBA team in the play-by-play era.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors fell to the top Eastern Conference team in their final game of a season-long tying five-game homestand (Feb. 1-11) ahead of the NBA All-Star break. A loss to the Detroit Pistons tonight extending their losing streak to seven-straight against Detroit, including three in a row at home. Toronto finishes their homestand with a 3-2 record and are now 4-13 against the top ten teams in the NBA. Following NBA-All Star Weekend, the Raptors will hit the road for matchups against the Chicago Bulls (Feb. 19) and the Milwaukee Bucks (Feb. 22).
- Immanuel Quickley led Raptors scorers with 18 points and dished out a team-high tying five assists in 32 minutes of action tonight. His four three-point field goals extends his streak with 3+ three-point field goals to five consecutive games, tied for the longest streak of his career. It also marks the second-longest streak by a Raptor this season, just behind Brandon Ingram – who recorded 3+ three-point field goals in six straight games in December.
- Scottie Barnes added 17 points, seven rebounds, five assists, four blocks, and three steals in 30 minutes tonight. This marked his 11<sup>th</sup> game of the season with 5+ stocks (steals + blocks) this season – tied for most such games in the NBA this season. Barnes has now reached 400 career steals and is now the only player in the NBA with 70+ steals and 400+ rebounds this season.
- Jakob Poeltl made his return to the starting lineup after missing 23 games (Dec. 23 - Feb. 5) due to a low back strain.
- NBA All-Star 2026: The NBA announced Tuesday that Brandon Ingram has been named by Commissioner Adam Silver as an injury replacement for the All-Star Game. He will now join Scottie Barnes in LA, becoming the seventh duo of players to represent Toronto at an All-Star Game. In addition, Raptors rookies Collin Murray-Boyles and Alijah Martin were selected to participate in the 2026 Castrol Rising Stars showcase, joining Team Melo and Team Austin, respectively. Martin will join AJ Lawson in the NBA G League Next Up Game. Raptors Head Coach Darko Rajaković was named as the coach for the World Team at the All-Star Game.

**PISTONS NOTES**

- The Detroit Pistons (40-13) defeated the Toronto Raptors in the first game of a three-game season series and join the Oklahoma City Thunder (41-13) as the only teams to win 40 games this season. The Pistons have now won seven straight games against the Raptors – including three straight at Scotiabank Arena – marking Detroit's longest active winning streak against any team. The Pistons will resume their four-game road swing on Feb. 19 in New York.
- The Pistons outscored the Raptors 50-to-34 (+16) in points in the paint. Detroit is second in the league in PTP.
- The Pistons also improved to 33-11 (.750) when recording 40+ rebounds which is the third-best winning percentage in the league in those games. The Pistons rank seventh in the NBA in rebounds per game (45.6).
- Cade Cunningham finished with game highs of 28 points and nine assists. Entering play, Cunningham ranked fifth in scoring average among players in the East and second in the league in assists per game.
- Paul Reed made his first start since Jan. 10 and scored 16 of his 22 points in the first quarter. His 16 points are the most he has scored in any quarter in his career and the 10th time he has scored 10+ points in a quarter. Reed also finished with five rebounds, three assists, four blocks and two steals in 33 minutes of action.
- Tobias Harris finished with 12 points and a game-high 11 rebounds for his first double-double of the season.
- NBA All-Star 2026: Jalen Duren earned his first career All-Star selection. He will join guard Cade Cunningham who was voted as a starter, and head coach J.B. Bickerstaff who was selected as a head coach. The trio marks the first time since 2006 the Pistons will have multiple players and their coach representing the franchise.
