**KEY STAT**

The Oklahoma City Thunder outrebounded the Toronto Raptors 49-to-34 (+15) and are now 22-3 when outrebounding their opponents this season.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors fell to the Oklahoma City Thunder on Tuesday and split the two-game season series for the first time since the 2022-23 campaign. With the loss, the Raptors fall to 16-14 at Scotiabank Arena this season.
- The Raptors will travel to Washington to play the Wizards in the third game of a three-game season series on Saturday night before heading back home to host the New York Knicks.
- RJ Barrett led the Raptors in scoring with 21 points – 11 of which came in the first quarter – and in rebounds with eight. He finished with a season-high tying four three-point field goals hitting the 700 career three-point field goals mark – becoming the 10th Canadian to make 700-or-more three-point field goals.
- Scottie Barnes finished with 15 points, a game-high tying seven assists along with four blocks and three steals. Barnes is just the third player to record 5+ assists, 4+ blocks and 3+ steals joining Craig Porter Jr. and Jalen Suggs. Tonight marks the 10th time he has recorded multiple steals and multiple blocks in a game this season which leads the NBA. It is also the 29th such game of his career which ties Doug Christie for third-most in franchise history.
- Ja’Kobe Walter led all reserves with 17 points on 6-of-9 shooting, including a season-high tying five three-point field goals. Walter has scored in double digits in two of his last three games (Feb. 19-24) averaging 13.3 points while shooting 46.4% (13-28) from the field. He has led the bench in scoring 10 times this season.
- Collin Murray-Boyles has now recorded at least one steal or one block in 21 consecutive games (Dec. 21 – Feb. 24). He joins New Orleans’ Derik Queen as the only rookies to record 40+ steals and 40+ blocks this season.

**THUNDER NOTES**

- Despite a fourth quarter push from the Toronto Raptors, the Oklahoma City Thunder went on to win their third consecutive game in the first game of a two-game road trip. The Thunder split the season series 1-1 after dropping their first matchup against Toronto last month. Since the start of last season, Oklahoma City holds an 89-12 record when leading after the first half of play. The Thunder’s 116 points bring them to a 40-5 record this season when scoring 110+. Heading into play, they were tied for fourth in the league in scoring, averaging 119.5 points per contest on 48.6% shooting (third in the NBA).
- Cason Wallace led all scorers with a career-high tying 27 points. He has now scored 20+ points + four times this season and in consecutive games for the first time in his NBA career. Wallace also tied his season high with eight rebounds and dished out seven assists and a steal in 35 minutes of action.
- Isaiah Joe scored 19 of his 22 points in the third quarter to help outscore the Raptors 38-to-29 in those 12 minutes of play. This marks the fourth time Joe has scored a season high of 22 points this year.
- Off the bench: Alex Caruso finished with one point shy of his season-high, recording a bench-leading 16 points, knocking down two three-point field goals and dishing out four assists in 23 minutes. Caruso also finished with a game-high +22.
- Canada Basketball night: With Canadian teammate Shai Gilgeous-Alexander out due to an abdominal strain, Lu Dort took the court in front of a Canadian crowd and recorded 15 points and three three-point field goals. The Montreal native added five rebounds, three assists, and a steal in 34 minutes.
