KEY STAT

The San Antonio Spurs held the Toronto Raptors to 17 points in the fourth quarter, outscoring them 32-to-17 (+15). The Spurs have now extended their winning streak to a league-best ten consecutive games.

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors fell to the number two ranked Western Conference team with a 110-107 loss against the San Antonio Spurs tonight. They move to 16-15 at home this season with ten remaining games at Scotiabank Arena in the regular season. Despite the loss, the Raptors outrebounded the Spurs 50-to-40 (+10), including 38 defensive rebounds to San Antonio's 34 defensive rebounds against the second-best defensive rebounding team in the NBA this season. Toronto led by 12 points at the end of the third quarter, marking the fourth time this season they have given up a double-digit lead through three quarters, the most in the NBA this season.
- Brandon Ingram recorded a team-high tying 20 points and a season-high 11 rebounds, along with four assists in 37 minutes of play. This was his second double-double of the season. His previous high was ten rebounds Jan. 12 vs. Philadelphia. He now has 331 boards on the season and is 49 rebounds away from tying his single-season record of 380 in 2019-20.
- Immanuel Quickley poured in a team-high tying 20 points (6-12 FG, 3-5 3PT), four rebounds, and four assists in 37 minutes tonight, surpassing 150 three-point field goals this season. Quickley continues to lead the team in three-point field goals made this season.
- Jakob Poeltl made second appearance off the bench in the last week after missing last night's game due to lower back strain injury management and recorded 15 points, seven rebounds, a season-high three blocks, and a steal in 28 minutes. Poeltl has now reached 400 steals on his NBA career.
- Scottie Barnes added 15 points, four rebounds, three steals, two assists and a block in 31 minutes on the floor.
- Jamal Shead recorded his 13th double-digit game of the season with 12 points, including his eighth as a reserve, adding three assists and a rebounds in 19 minutes of action tonight.

SPURS NOTES

- The San Antonio Spurs overcame a 15-point second-half deficit and have now won 10 consecutive games (Feb. 2-25), marking the longest active winning streak in the NBA. The Spurs have now five straight against the Raptors and have swept the season series in consecutive years. San Antonio will continue their five-game road trip (Feb. 23 - Mar. 3) tomorrow evening in Brooklyn to take on the Nets in the second game of the back-to-back set.
- San Antonio improve to 42-16 on the season and remain the second seed in the Western Conference behind the defending champions Oklahoma City Thunder.
- Devin Vassell led all players with 21 points (8-13 FG) making five three-point field goals for the fifth time this season. He has scored 20+ points in consecutive games for the second time this season (Feb. 23-25) and first since doing so in three straight from Nov. 26-30. Vassell has now led the Spurs in scoring five times this year..
- Dylan Harper led all Spurs reserves with 15 points (7-11 FG) in 29 minutes off the bench. The 2025 second overall pick leads all rookies in total points off the bench this season (517) and ranks 10th in scoring average (11.0) among first year players. Harper also led all players with seven assists. He ranks sixth in assists per game among rookies.
- Victor Wembanyama recorded all five of San Antonio's blocks tonight. He has now recorded 5+ blocks in a league-leading 11 games this season and leads the league in total blocks with 126. Wembanyama finished with 12 points (3-12 FG, 1-6, 3PT, 5-6 FT) marking his lowest points total since also scoring 12 Dec. 23 vs. Oklahoma City.
