**KEY STAT**

The New York Knicks held the Toronto Raptors to a season-low tying 13 points in the fourth quarter to secure their victory tonight.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors fall 111-95 to the New York Knicks at Scotiabank Arena Tuesday night, extending their losing streak to a franchise-worst 12 consecutive losses – including seven straight at home. Toronto’s 12-game record is tied for their fifth-longest losing streak against any one team in franchise history. They are now .500 at home this season with a 16-16 record. This marked their fourth matchup this season and the two teams will face off for a fifth and final time in the regular season on April 10 at New York.
- Brandon Ingram finished with a game-high 31 points (11-20 FG, 3-5 3PT), along with four assists, two rebounds, a steal, and a block in 37 minutes of action. 26 of his 31 points came within the first half, marking the most a Raptor has scored in any half of play since RJ Barrett scored 26 points on Jan. 7, 2024. This also marked Ingram’s ninth game with 30+ points this season, tying Gary Trent Jr. for third-most such games in their first season as a Raptor.
- RJ Barrett poured in 20 points and added four rebounds, and three assists for his second straight game with 20+ points and his 71<sup>st</sup> such game as a Raptor, surpassing former Raptor and current Knick OG Anunoby for 11<sup>th</sup> on the franchise history. Barrett has now recorded 20 or more points in four of his last six games against New York; averaging 20.6 points against his former team heading into tonight.
- Immanuel Quickley scored 13 points and dished out 12 assists for his eighth double-double of the season and has consecutive double-double performances for the first time since Jan. 3, 2025 and for the fifth time in his career. Quickley’s 12 assists are just one shy of tying his season-high of 13 and he has also surpassed 1,000 season points for the third time in his NBA career.

**KNICKS NOTES**

- The New York Knicks defeated the Toronto Raptors for their third-straight win and five of their last six contests (Feb. 21 – Mar. 3). Tonight also marks their 12<sup>th</sup> consecutive game against the Raptors including six straight on the road.
- The Knicks improve to 40-22 – sitting third in the Eastern Conference – and become the fifth team to win 40 games this season (Oklahoma City, San Antonio Spurs, Detroit Pistons and Boston Celtics).
- The Knicks shot 56.1% (46-82) from the field and have now shot 50%+ in 20 games this season improving to 17-3.
- New York will look to extend their winning streak at home tomorrow night against the Oklahoma City Thunder ahead of a five-game road trip (Mar. 6-13).
- Jalen Brunson led all Knicks with 26 points (10-22 FG) and 10 assists. Brunson has scored 20+ points in four straight games and in six of their last seven games (Feb. 19 – Mar. 3). His 47<sup>th</sup> game of 20+ points ties Kevin Durant for fourth-most such games in the league this season. Brunson entered play ranked ninth in scoring average (26.7).
- Karl-Anthony Towns finished with 21 points and a game-high 13 rebounds for his third straight double-double (Feb. 27 – Mar. 3) and his league-leading 42<sup>nd</sup> double-double this season. Towns ranked second in the NBA in rebounds per game (11.8) entering play.
- Former Raptors OG Anunoby finished with 15 points (5-6 FG, 2-2, 3PT) and five rebounds in 27 minutes of play. He entered tonight averaging 20.8 points in six games against the Raptors while shooting 57.3% from the field.
