KEY STAT

Tonight marked the Toronto Raptors' 12th double-digit comeback win of the season, tied for fifth-most in the NBA. This was also their fourth time coming back from being down 10+ in the fourth quarter, tied for second-most in the NBA.

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Phoenix Suns snapping a two-game losing streak and improving to 18-16 at Scotiabank Arena this season. The Raptors have now won four straight home games against the Suns for the first time in team history. Toronto will host Detroit on Sunday afternoon to complete two-game homestand looking to even the three-game season series at one game apiece.
- Toronto shot 53.5% (46-86) from the field including 51.9% (14-27) from three-point range tonight. It is the fourth time the team has shot 50%+ from the field and from beyond the arc improving to 3-1 in those games this season and 123-26 in 149 games in franchise history.
- The Raptors outscored the Suns 60-to-32 (+28) in the paint tonight. The Raptors are top-10 in the league in points in the paint per game this season.
- Brandon Ingram scored a game-high 36 points (13-20 FG, 5-6 3PT) falling one point shy of his season-high. Ingram has scored 20+ points in back-to-back games since Feb. 28 – Mar. 3 and has now scored 20+ points 40 times becoming the 15th player in the NBA this season to record 20+ points at least 40 times. Ingram has scored 20+ points in nine of last 12 career games against Phoenix including 25+ points six times.
- RJ Barrett finished with 22 points and has now scored 20+ points in four straight games against the Suns. He has scored 20+ points in six of his last seven games (Feb. 28 – Mar. 13) averaging 22.9 points while shooting 58.3%.
- Scottie Barnes recorded multiple blocks for the 24th time this season and needs one block to reach 100 on the season. He is the only player in the league to total 90+ blocks and 80+ steals this season.

SUNS NOTES

- The Phoenix Suns dropped a Friday night matchup to the Toronto Raptors at Scotiabank Arena, halting a season-second best four-game winning streak in the second night of a back-to-back set on the road. With 18 three-point field goals to Toronto's 14, Phoenix is now 34-10 when they record more three-point field goals than their opponents this season. This marked the third game of a season-long tying six game road trip (Mar. 10 -19). The Suns will now travel to Boston to face the Celtics.
- Jalen Green, coming off a season-high of 36 points Thursday night at Indiana, followed it up with 34 points and a career-high tying eight three-point field goals – his most in a game since Oct. 24, 2021. Green also added five rebounds, four assists, and a steal in 35 minutes on the floor. Green and teammate Devin Booker have combined for 144 points in their last two games (Mar. 12-13).
- Devin Booker, also coming off a season-high of 43 points Thursday night at Indiana, recorded 17 of his 31 points in the first half. Booker came into tonight averaging 26.5 points on the second night of a back-to-back. He now holds 499 career games in Phoenix with 20+ points and 227 games with 30+, their leading scorer.
- Grayson Allen led bench scorers with 15 points and dished out a team-high six assists, adding two rebounds and a steal in 29 minutes as a reserve. The rest of Phoenix's bench combined for 24 to outscore Toronto's reserves 39-to-27.
