**KEY STAT**

The Raptors allowed a season-high 29 second chance points from the Sacramento Kings despite outscoring them in second-chance points 23-to-7. The Kings outrebounded the Raptors 48-to-32 (+16), including 19-to-5 (+14) on the offensive glass.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors fell to the Sacramento Kings in the second game of their second-to-last back-to-back set of the season. They went 0-2, losing two consecutive games and now hold a 5-9 (.357) record in the second game of their back-to-back sets this season. They will split the season series 1-1 and embark on a two-game road trip against the Memphis Grizzlies and the Boston Celtics before returning home for two games against the Miami Heat. Toronto sits at seventh in the Eastern Conference following tonight's loss.
- The Raptors finished with two players that scored 15+ points off the bench for the third time this season, and for the first time since March 18. Sandro Mamukelashvili added 17 points while Collin Murray-Boyles poured in 20 points.
- RJ Barrett scored a team-high tying 20 points, six assists, and five rebounds and has now recorded 20+ points in three consecutive games. Rookie Collin Murray-Boyles also recorded 20 points, marking a career-high in 18 minutes off the bench tonight for the first 20-point game of his NBA career. His previous high was 19 points Oct. 27.
- Scottie Barnes recorded his 29<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season with 14 points and ten assists, adding five rebounds and two steals in 35 minutes of action tonight. He now has 10+ assists in a career-high six consecutive games, which is tied for the third-longest streak in Raptors franchise history. It's the longest streak by a Raptor since Kyle Lowry (2020). Barnes is one of four players to have six consecutive games with 10+ assists in team history.
- Jakob Poeltl added 18 points, five rebounds, and two steals in 28 minutes. He now has 10+ points in five straight games which marks his second-longest streak with double-digit points this season.
- Jamal Shead earned his 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season and finished with 16 points, seven assists, and a team-high +17.

**KINGS NOTES**

- The Sacramento Kings defeated the Toronto Raptors on Wednesday night splitting the season series at one game apiece. With the win, the Kings snapped a four-game losing streak and finished the five-game Eastern Conference road trip (Mar. 24 - Apr. 1) with a 1-4 record. Sacramento has five games remaining on the season including a two-game homestand starting on Friday against New Orleans.
- The Kings outrebounded the Raptors 48-to-32 (+16) in total rebounds and 19-to-5 (+14) on the offensive glass. The 19 offensive boards ties a season-high which Sacramento has now done three times.
- The Kings also outscored the Raptors in second chance points 29-to-10 (+19). The 29 second chance points are the most scored against Toronto this season.
- Former Raptor Precious Achiuwa recorded a game-high tying 28 points along with a game and season high 19 rebounds for his 11<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season which is fourth-most on the team. Achiuwa has scored in double digits in 10 straight games (Mar. 11 - Apr. 1) including 20+ points three times, averaging 16.9 points while shooting 57.9% from the field in that span. Achiuwa is averaging a career-high 9.9 points this season.
- Former Raptor DeMar DeRozan finished with a game-high tying 28 points after scoring just two points in the first half. DeRozan has scored 20+ points in three straight games (Mar. 26 - Apr. 1). Entering today, DeRozan averaged 22.5 points in 20 career games against the Raptors. DeRozan has now scored 7,111 points in Toronto, including his games as a visitor, which is the most by any player. Earlier tonight, he passed Dominique Wilkins (26,666) for 17<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time scoring list.
