**KEY STAT**

The Toronto Raptors have recorded 30+ assists in seven consecutive games, marking a franchise record.

**RAPTORS NOTES**

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Miami Heat on Tuesday night, taking the first three games of the season series. It is the first season series win since the 2022-23 campaign. The Raptors can sweep the Heat on Thursday night for the first time since the 2018-19 season. With the win tonight, the Raptors maintain the sixth seed in the East.
- The Raptors finished with a 34-to-26 (+8) advantage in assists tonight. Toronto has now recorded 30+ assists in a franchise-high seven straight games (Mar. 27 - Apr. 5).
- The Raptors also outrebounded the Heat 56-to-44 (+12) tonight. The 56 rebounds are the second-most total rebounds by Toronto this season and the 14th time recording 50+ boards. Toronto is 11-3 in those games.
- Jamal Shead finished with a game-high 11 assists in 23 minutes off the bench. Shead and the Heat's Jaime Jaquez are ranked first and second in assists off the bench in the NBA this season. Tonight marks Shead's sixth career game with 10+ assists off the bench tying Russell Westbrook for most in the NBA over the last two seasons.
- Scottie Barnes finished with a game-high 25 points, eight rebounds and five assists for his 74th 20/5/5 game of his career. He passes Vince Carter for third-most such games in Raptors franchise history. The 25 points is the most he has scored since scoring 26 points on Jan. 1 at Golden State.

**HEAT NOTES**

- The Miami Heat dropped their Tuesday night matchup against the Toronto Raptors and have now lost three consecutive games against the Raptors and will lose the season series. The two teams will face once more for the final time this regular season on Thursday night before travelling to Washington for their final road game of the regular season. The Heat will finish the regular season with a home game against Atlanta. These two straight games against Toronto mark the sixth and final occurrence this season in which Miami will face the same opponent consecutive times. In the previous five instances, Miami swept both games once and split the two games four times.
- This is just the sixth time the Heat have been held to below 100 points - three of which have come in games against the Raptors this season.
- Canadian Andrew Wiggins led Heat scorers for the seventh time this season, scoring 24 points and four three-point field goals. Miami is now 7-7 this season when Wiggins scores 20+. This marked Wiggins' second straight game with 20+ and he entered tonight averaging 12.0 points against the Raptors in this year's season series and 20.2 points against the Raptors all-time, which is the third-best scoring average by a Canadian vs. the Raptors.
- Tyler Herro missed the Heat's previous game but returned tonight and recorded 14 points, six assists, and five rebounds. He averaged 26.3 points against the Raptors during the 2024-25 campaign. Former Raptor Norman Powell also added 14 points off the bench.
- Bam Adebayo's game-high nine rebounds brought him to 700 rebounds on the season, marking his third consecutive season with 700+ recorded rebounds.
