The Toronto Raptors outscored the Miami Heat in free throws tonight, shooting 27-of-34 from the free throw line, compared to Miami's 8-of-14.

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Miami Heat and have swept the four-game season series for the first time since the 2018-19 campaign. It is also the third time the Raptors have swept the Heat. With the win, the Raptors hold identical Raptors with the Atlanta Hawks at 45-35. Toronto swept Atlanta in the season series 4-0. The Hawks, who do not play tonight, host the Cleveland Cavaliers tomorrow.
- The Raptors play New York Knicks in second game of back-to-back tomorrow night at Madison Square Garden marking their last regular season road game of the season. Toronto will play their final game of the 2025-26 regular season on Sunday at home against the Brooklyn Nets.
- Toronto Raptors Head Coach Darko Rajakovic earned his 100th win as Head Coach of the Raptors. He is the fifth Raptors Head Coach to win 100+ games joining Dwane Casey (320), Nick Nurse (227), Sam Mitchell (156) and Lenny Wilkens (113).
- The Raptors shot 51.2% (44-for-86) from the field and improve to 24-6 in the 30 games they have shot 50 percent or better from the field this season. Toronto also finished with a 6-to-15 (-9) advantage in turnovers tonight. The six turnovers match a season low which they have done three times.
- Brandon Ingram scored 23 points in the first half – the second-most he has in a half this season – and finished with a game and season-high 38 points. This marks his 12th 30-point game of the season, his most since doing so in 13 games during the 2022-23 NBA season. He also finished with a team-high seven assists and seven rebounds.
- RJ Barrett scored 22 points tonight and has now scored 20+ points in 10 career games against the Heat. Entering tonight, he averaged 20.7 points while shooting 50.5% from the field in 20 career games against Miami.
- Collin Murray-Boyles led all reserves with 17 points along with a team-high eight rebounds while adding two steals and one block in 22 minutes off the bench. Murray-Boyles has scored in double digits in five of his last six games (Mar. 31 – Apr. 9) including 15+ points three times.

HEAT NOTES

- The Miami Heat dropped their Thursday night matchup against the Toronto Raptors and have now lost four consecutive games against the Raptors, getting swept by Toronto in the season series 0-4 for the first time since 2018-19. These two straight games against Toronto marked the sixth and final occurrence this season in which Miami will face the same opponent consecutive times. In the previous five instances, Miami swept both games once and split the two games four times. The Heat will travel to Washington for their final road game of the regular season and their 17th back-to-back this season, tied for the most in the NBA. The Heat will finish the regular season with a home game against Atlanta before appearing in the play-in tournament next week.
- Bam Adebayo led Miami scorers with 24 points, 11 rebounds, eight assists, two blocks, and a steal for his 33rd double-double of the season. Miami is now 15-18 this season when Adebayo records a double-double.
- Tyler Herro added 15 points after recording 14 points Tuesday night. Former Raptor Davion Mitchell also added 15 points and dished out 11 assists for his fifth double-double of the season and the ninth time he has recorded ten-or-more assists this season. He had a season quarter-high tying six assists in the third quarter.
- Jaime Jaquez Jr. led Heat reserves with 15 points (6-9 FG, 3-5 3PT). Entering tonight, he led the Heat bench in points, field goals made, points in the paint, fast break points and points off turnovers.
