KEY STAT

The Toronto Raptors scored a season-high 40 fastbreak points – this is the seventh time they have scored 30+ points in the fastbreak this season, the most by any NBA team this season.

RAPTORS NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Brooklyn Nets and finish the 2025-25 regular season with a 46-36 record overall and 24-17 at home. Last season, the Raptors finished 30-52 and 18-23 respectively. The 16-win difference from last season is the fourth-largest improvement in record in team history and highest since the 2021-22 campaign (+21).
- With the win, the Raptors officially clinched a playoff berth for the first time since 2022 where they faced the Philadelphia 76ers in the Eastern Conference First Round.
- The Raptors outscored the Nets in fast break points 40-to-10 (+30) and will finish the league first in fast break points per game. The Raptors also finished with a 36-to-21 (+15) advantage in assists. Entering tonight, the Raptors ranked third in the league in total assists (2,381).
- Scottie Barnes recorded 18 points, 12 rebounds and 12 assists for his third triple-double of the season and ninth of his career. He becomes the only player in franchise history to record 3+ triple-doubles in multiple seasons. Barnes finishes the season with single-season career highs in total points (1448), rebounds (600), assists (474), steals (114) and blocks (116). Barnes is the only player in the NBA to total 100+ blocks and 100+ steals this season.
- Brandon Ingram finished with a game-high 23 tonight. Through 77 games played this season, he totalled 1,655 points which is the 10th most points scored by a Raptors player in a single-season. Ingram's 77 games played this season is the most he has played since starring in 79 contests in the 2016-17 campaign with the Lakers.
- RJ Barrett finished with 26 points and reached 3,000+ career points with the Raptors becoming the 23rd player in franchise history to reach 3,000 points. Over his last 24 games of the season, Barrett has scored 20-or-more points in 16 contests averaging 21.0 points while shooting 51.6% in that span.
- Jamal Shead – who played in all 82 games this season – finished with six points, one rebound, four assists, one steal and one block in 20 minutes off the bench. He is the first Raptor to play 82 games in a regular season since Jakob Poeltl did so in 2017-18. Shead is just the 17th player in franchise history to play in 82 games.

NETS NOTES

- The Brooklyn Nets dropped their eighth consecutive road game with a loss to the Toronto Raptors Sunday night in the finale of the NBA regular season. They will lose the season series 1-3 and finish the year with an overall 20-62 record, 13th in the Eastern Conference.
- Tyson Etienne led all Nets scorers with 20 points off the bench, He made two three-point field goals, extending his streak with at least one three-point field goal to 16 straight games, the fourth-longest by a Net this season.
- E.J. Liddell scored 11 of his 17 points in the first quarter and added four rebounds, one assist, and a steal.
- Two-way player Chaney Johnson added 16 points and 13 rebounds for the first double-double of his career – his 13 rebounds mark a career-high and his 16 points are just one point shy of tying his career-high.
