How to use

Using these questions, or questions developed by the community group, conduct a community survey to inform an understanding of resilience from the broader community...

Community survey questions

1. Are you from the local XXX area?
2. How would you rate your understanding of fires, floods, and other threats within our community? (1 being poor and 10 being excellent)
3. How prepared would you be right now if an emergency situation occurred? (1 being not prepared and 10 being very prepared)
4. How prepared do you feel the community would be right now if an emergency situation occurred? (1 being not prepared and 10 being very prepared)
5. In a few words, how would you describe your ability to deal with a potential emergency situation within the community? (examples include informed, confident, worried)
6. In a few words, how would you describe the community's ability to deal with a potential emergency situation within the community? (examples include informed, confident, worried)
7. In the event of an emergency what do you believe would be the single greatest project that could improve preparedness/resilience within our community?
