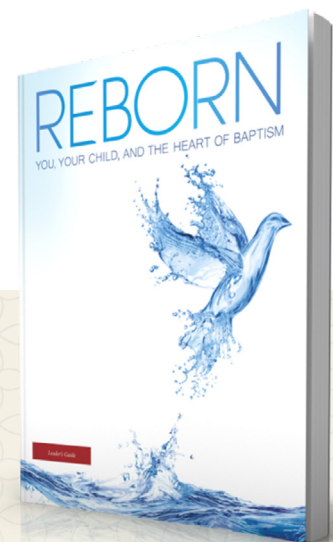

HOW TO USE *REBORN* IN YOUR PARISH:

- Baptismal preparation for parents and godparents
- Adult faith formation
- Family faith formation
- Parochial school parent formation
- Advent and Lent parish-wide study
- Parish retreats, missions, small-group discussions

Evangelization and Parish Outreach

- Invite expecting grandparents to a three-week *Reborn* study to remember the importance of Baptism for their grandchildren.
- Fill a bottle of holy water from the baptismal font to give the parents of the baptized child as a keepsake.
- Invite parents of Confirmation candidates to watch *Reborn* to remind them of the connection between Confirmation and Baptism.
- Show *Reborn* in adult faith formation to parents whose children attend your parish school.

Schedule

A template for how to facilitate one 90-minute *Reborn* session:

Time	Steps	Overview
5 minutes	Opening Prayer	Begin with Opening Prayer. Model how to pray for the participants.
5 minutes	Testimony	Invite a faithful parishioner to share their testimony.
40 minutes	Play Episode 1	Play first episode.
20 minutes	Small Group Discussion	Invite conversation based off content.
10 minutes	Large Group Q&A	Share questions as a large group.
5 minutes	Call to Action	Discuss one practical way the group can make the content concrete in their life. For example, parents can find out the date of their own baptism before the next session.
5 minutes	Closing Prayer	End with Closing Prayer.
