



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<p>DT</p> <p>We are looking at Structures, making Anderson shelters, linked to our History learning. Can you make some structures, designed to keep something safe? See which shaped structure keeps the object the safest.</p> 	<p>Art</p> <p>In Art we are exploring the work of Picasso, one of the most famous artists in the 20th century. We will be studying his work on portraits. Can you create portraits, inspired by Picasso, of your friends and family?</p> 	<p>PE</p> <p>This term in PE, we will be looking at the sports handball and hockey. As well as practising these sports at home, can you create a poster or a booklet explaining the rules of each of the sports and how they are similar and different. Are the skills used in these sports like other sports? What tactics may you develop in each of these games?</p> 
<p>Science</p> <p>Gravity and air resistance are non contact forces. Can you investigate these forces by making your own parachutes? You could experiment with different materials and shapes.</p> 	<p>PSHE</p> <p>During our Health and Well-being unit, we will be focusing on meditation, rest and owning our feelings. Take some time to try different mindfulness activities: mindful breathing, yoga or grounding techniques</p> 	<p>Geography</p> <p>In Geography, we are learning about the dangers of tsunamis, volcanoes and earthquakes. Can you locate on a map the 'ring of fire' where most earthquakes happen and home to most volcanoes. Can you name any volcanoes?</p> 
<p>Computing</p> <p>Can you find out about E-SAFETY? Why is it important to think about what we write on the internet?</p> <p>Create a poster giving advice about what how to be a good friend when using social media and messaging apps.</p>	<p>Language Angels</p> <p>In French, we have been exploring different topics, whilst applying what we have learnt in our phonics sessions to decode new words. Using your Language Angels log in, continue to expand your language skills through karaoke and games.
