**HOW TO CLONE YOURSELF  
FOR MAXIMUM GROWTH**

# FLOWSTATE

This checklist will walk you through how to split yourself in two: **the calm "CEO you"** writes the growth plan like you're commanding a clone, and the **in-the-moment "operator you"** follows those instructions without negotiating—so you execute what the business needs (not what feels good) for maximum growth.

## The 60-Second Diagnostic

Answer with brutal honesty:

If my business stayed the same size for 12 months, would I still be happy doing the work I'm doing daily?

Do I regularly choose tasks because they feel good (creative, polished, "flowy") even when I know what would grow the business faster?

If I had to bet \$10,000 on the one activity that would grow my business this month, do I know what it is—and am I doing it first?

- if 2+ are true for you (instead of checked)

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## Clarify Your True Priority

Choose one and commit for the next 30 days:

### Business Growth First

(I will do what the business needs, regardless of enjoyment)

### Entrepreneurial Hedonism

(I want a business that maximizes my enjoyment—even if growth slows)

**Rule:** If you choose Growth First, you are no longer allowed to use "flow" as the deciding variable for what you work on.

**Write this sentence:**

"For the next 30 days, my priority is: \_\_\_\_\_."

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## Categorize Your Work

List your recurring tasks this week and sort them into the 3 buckets:

### A) High-Flow (Feels Great)

Examples: content, designing, brainstorming, building, writing, product tinkering

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# Write The Business-First Operating Manual (Cold Cognition)

Do this when calm. Not mid-work

## Prompt:

If a clone ran my business for the next 7 days and wanted maximum growth, what would they do?

Write orders to your clone. Use verbs. Make it specific\*

- Do \_\_\_\_\_ for \_\_\_\_ minutes.
- Contact \_\_\_\_\_ people.

## Your "Growth List" must pass these tests:

If I did ONLY this list for 7 days, the business would measurably move.

It includes at least one activity that creates revenue now (sales / offers / partnerships).

It includes at least one activity that creates pipeline (outreach / events / follow-ups).

It has clear quantities (calls, emails, proposals, meetings, demos, offers).

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## Execution Rule (Hot Cognition) (Daily, 7 Days)

When you sit down to work, you will feel pulled toward "fun work."

Run this in order:

### The Gatekeeper Check

- Open your Operating Manual.
- Ask: "Is the task I'm about to do on the Growth List?"

If **YES** → do it.

If **NO** → don't do it (capture it in the Parking Lot below).

### The 15-Minute Override (when the struggle phase hits)

If you want to bail, do this:

- Set a timer for **15 minutes** on the Growth task.
- Tell yourself: "I'm not committing to the whole thing—just 15 minutes."
- After 15 minutes: continue if momentum is building; otherwise take a short break and restart.

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# Let Strategy Determine Schedule (Once Per Week)

Convert the Growth List into a calendar so you're not "deciding" every day.

## Business-First Scheduling Rules

1. Growth work happens first (before creative/flow work).

2. Schedule one daily Growth Block (60–120 minutes).

3. Put High-Flow non-growth tasks after Growth Block or outside work hours.

4. If it's not scheduled, it's optional—and optional work becomes hedonism.

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## The Anti-Hedonism Tripwire (Use Mid-Day)

If you catch yourself drifting:

### Ask:

"Is this what the business needs –or  
what I want to work on?"

"If I had to delegate this, would I still  
choose it as a top growth lever?"

"Would I be proud if my team copied  
my task choices today?"

- If any answer exposes drift: Switch immediately to the next Growth List item.

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## 7-Day Scorecard (End Of Every Day)
