

Self-Assessment – Know Your Strengths Before You Switch

Identifying transferable skills is the first step in planning a career change.



Skill Categories

- Soft Skills: Leadership, communication, teamwork, adaptability
- Technical Skills: Data analysis, software proficiency, industry tools
- Project/Organizational Skills: Strategic planning, time management

A skills audit helps you position yourself in a new field with confidence.





Clarifying Career Interests & Priorities

Ask yourself the big questions to define what really matters:

- What roles or tasks energize you?
- *Which industries align with your values or long-term goals?
- What are your non-negotiables? (e.g., salary, remote work, job security)
- 6 What challenges are you excited to take on?

Set SMART Goals for a Smooth Career Change

Short-Term (0–6 months)

- Research new roles & skill needs
- Update resume & LinkedIn
- Take online courses or certifications
- Start networking

Mid-Term (6–12 months)

- Join webinars, attend events
- Gain hands-on experience (freelance, internships, volunteer)
- Apply for jobs & prep for interviews

Long-Term (1+ years)

- Secure a stable role in your new field
- Keep learning & growing
- Build your professional brand in the new industry

Tip to remember


Measurable, time-bound goals = less overwhelm, more momentum.

- **Healthcare & Allied Health Nursing, medical tech, telehealth
- Renewable Energy Solar/wind energy, sustainability consulting
- → Digital Marketing & E-Commerce SEO, content strategy, social media
- Sinancial Services Fintech, financial planning, data analytics
- Education & Online Learning E-learning design, academic counseling
- Use tools like the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) or LinkedIn Workforce Reports to track growth & salary trends.

Marketing/Comms:

- SEO, content strategy, Google Ads
- Social media tools (HubSpot, Meta Business Suite)

Finance & Accounting:

- CPA or CFA
- Financial modeling, Excel
- Risk analysis tools

Use Informational Interviews & Job Shadowing

L Informational Interviews:

- Connect via LinkedIn, alumni networks, or Slack communities
- Ask about job expectations, day-to-day work, and growth paths
- Build rapport—may lead to mentorship or referrals!

Job Shadowing:

- Observe professionals on the job
- Understand actual workflows and challenges
- Decide if the work aligns with your skills and interests
- These low-risk strategies = high return in clarity and connections.

Industry-Specific Training & Degree Programs

Some careers need formal training—choose what fits your timeline, budget, and end goals.

Degrees

- Associate's/Bachelor's: BSN (nursing),
 BBA (business), BS (data science)
- Graduate programs: For advanced roles in education, counseling, public health, etc.

- Coding (General Assembly, Le Wagon)

Build Experience with Internships, Freelance & Volunteer Work

- Internships & Apprenticeships:
 - Short-term, practical roles
 - Great for building a portfolio
 - Look for "returnships" for career re-entry

- Freelance & Volunteer Work:
 - Gain experience + testimonials
 - Offer services to nonprofits, startups, or local businesses
 - Use platforms like Upwork, Fiverr, Catchafire

Propertience > just coursework. Show what you've done, not just what you've studied.





Resume, Branding & Job Search Strategy

Your resume should emphasize your potential rather than just listing previous job titles. Remember, your LinkedIn profile serves as your digital first impression, so ensure it aligns with your career aspirations. Instead of merely applying, focus on positioning yourself and building connections.





How to Craft a Resume for a Career Change

Use a Functional or Hybrid Format

- Focus on skills & achievements—not just a chronological history
- Highlight relevant certifications, volunteer work, freelance projects

Emphasize Transferable Skills

- Match your past strengths to your new role (e.g., "team leadership" → "project coordination")
- Mirror language from job descriptions

Optimize for ATS (Applicant Tracking Systems)

- Use industry-specific keywords
- Stick to clear headers, bullet points, and clean formatting

Write a Strong Career Change Summary

 Example: "Results-driven educator pivoting into instructional design leveraging skills in curriculum development, learning tech, and engagement."





Update Your LinkedIn & Build a Personal Brand

Your LinkedIn profile = your digital first impression. Make it reflect your career goals.

Rewrite Your Headline & Summary:

- Tell your transition story clearly and confidently
- Ex: "Operations manager → aspiring UX designer | Obsessed with solving problems through research & design."

E Revamp Your Experience Section:

- Focus on relevant skills, not just job titles
- Quantify past impact ("Managed \$1M project budget with 20% ROI improvement")

Engage with Industry Content:

- Share and comment on relevant posts
- Post about your learning journey, certifications, and projects

Expand Your Network:

- Connect with professionals in your target industry
- Join groups, attend virtual events, and follow companies you admire





Job Search & Networking Tips That Work

1. Use Targeted Job Boards:

- Tech: Stack Overflow, Dice
- Healthcare: Health eCareers
- Finance: eFinancialCareers
- Remote work: FlexJobs, Remote.co
- Career-return programs: Path Forward, iRelaunch

2. Leverage Informational Interviews:

- Request short calls with professionals
- Ask about their path, challenges, and advice
- Use LinkedIn, alumni networks, or events to reach out

3. Freelance or Contract First:

- Platforms: Upwork, Fiverr, Toptal
- Gain hands-on experience while building your portfolio

4. Attend Industry Meetups & Events:

- Go to virtual or in-person networking sessions
- Volunteer or help out at events to increase visibility





Overcoming Challenges in Career Transition

Addressing experience gaps involves thoughtful positioning and proactive skill development. Transitioning careers may bring financial concerns, but careful planning can facilitate a smoother shift. It's normal to feel like an imposter when venturing into a new field; however, adjusting your mindset can make a significant difference.







How to Handle Career Gaps & Lack of Experience

Leverage Transferable Skills

- Show how past experiences apply to the new field
- Ex: "Led a team in retail" →
 "Project coordination in tech"

Take Relevant Courses

 Showcase active learning (e.g., "Currently enrolled in Google UX Certificate")

Highlight Projects & Volunteer Work

- Include freelance, nonprofit, and personal projects
- Create a portfolio, even with unpaid work

Use a Strong Cover Letter

- Address your career change directly
- Ex: "After 5 years in education, I'm excited to bring my instructional design expertise to the elearning space."





Managing Finances During a Career Transition

Changing careers may come with short-term financial strain—plan ahead.

- Build an Emergency Fund
 - Aim for 3–6 months of expenses if possible
- **Explore Scholarships & Employer-Sponsored Training**
 - Many industries offer tuition reimbursement or career-switch support
- - Start with part-time, freelance, or contract work
- **X** Adjust Budget Temporarily
 - Cut non-essentials to reduce stress and stretch your runway
- Parealistic financial plan = more freedom to grow into your new role.





Confidence Boosters for Career Changers

Feeling like a fraud? You're not alone—imposter syndrome is normal, especially during change:

- Reframe Your Narrative: You're not "starting over"—you're bringing a new perspective
- Track milestones: certifications, interviews, portfolio projects
- Seek Support & Mentorship: Talk to people who've done it. Join communities or get a coach
- Remember: Careers Aren't Linear. Many successful people pivoted more than once
- Your mindset is just as important as your resume.
