Multi-Grafted Apple Tree (3 Varieties)	Apple	A single semi-dwarf tree with 3 different apple varieties grafted onto it, ensuring cross-pollination and a staggered harvest.	Self-Pollinating (due to multiple varieties)
Multi-Grafted Apple Tree (4 Varieties)	Apple	A single semi-dwarf tree with 4 different apple varieties grafted onto it, offering maximum variety in a small area.	Self-Pollinating (due to multiple varieties)
Arkansas Black Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf heirloom variety known for its dark red-purple skin, firm, crisp, tart flesh, and excellent storage qualities.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Gala, Fuji)
Empire Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf cross between McIntosh and Red Delicious, featuring firm, crisp, juicy, and slightly tart red apples perfect for fresh eating and salads.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Honeycrisp, Gala)
Enterprise Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf disease-resistant apple developed for its exceptional flavor, crisp texture, and long storage life. Matures to a deep red color.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Fuji, Goldrush)
Freedom Apple (New)	Apple	A semi-dwarf, disease-resistant apple bred for strong scab resistance, producing medium, crisp, tart-sweet red fruit good for fresh eating and cooking.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Liberty, Enterprise)
Fuji Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf, extremely popular sweet and crisp apple that stores well and is excellent for fresh eating. Skin is mottled red-pink over yellow-green.	Self-pollinating but yields better with a cross-pollinator (e.g., Granny Smith)
Gala Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf, early-ripening variety with a mild, sweet flavor and crisp texture. The skin is a blush of red/orange stripes over a yellow background.	Self-pollinating but yields better with a cross-pollinator (e.g., Fuji, Honeycrisp)
Granny Smith Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf, classic tart, firm, and crisp green apple, ideal for baking, cooking, and fresh eating.	Self-pollinating but yields better with a cross-pollinator (e.g., Fuji, Golden Delicious)
Gravenstein Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf heirloom apple known for its distinctive tart-sweet flavor, great for cooking, cider, and applesauce. Ripens mid-season.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., McIntosh, Honeycrisp)
Honeycrisp Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf, modern favorite prized for its exceptionally crisp texture, explosive juiciness, and balanced sweet-tart flavor.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Fuji, Gala)
Jonagold Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf cross of Jonathan and Golden Delicious, offering a large, beautiful apple with a sweet-tart, aromatic flavor. Excellent for all uses.	Needs a cross-pollinator (Triploid)
Jonathon Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf heritage variety known for its distinctively tart and tangy flavor, crisp flesh, and bright red skin. Great for baking and cider.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Golden Delicious)
King David Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf, dark red, old-time variety with a complex, spicy, rich flavor, excellent for fresh eating, cider, and keeping.	Self-pollinating
Liberty Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf, highly disease-resistant variety that produces medium-sized, crisp, juicy, sweet apples with a hint of tartness.	Self-pollinating but benefits from a cross-pollinator
McIntosh Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf classic variety with a distinctive tart-sweet flavor, snow-white, tender flesh, and aromatic scent. Perfect for fresh eating and sauces.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Red Delicious, Honeycrisp)
Pink Lady Apple	Apple	A semi-dwarf late-season apple with a pink blush over a green base. Known for its perfect balance of sweet-tart flavor and crisp texture.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Granny Smith, Fuji)

Moorpark Apricot	Apricot	A semi-dwarf, old English variety that produces large, flavorful, and sweet apricots with a freestone pit, often used for preserves.	Self-pollinating

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Bing Cherry	Cherry	A semi-dwarf, popular sweet cherry known for its large, firm, dark red fruit and rich, sweet flavor.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Van, Rainier)
Black Tartarian Cherry	Cherry	A semi-dwarf, old European variety that produces medium-sized, nearly black, sweet, and juicy cherries. A great pollinator.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Bing, Rainier)
Early Richmond Cherry	Sour Cherry (Pie Cherry)	A semi-dwarf, reliable sour cherry known for producing heavy crops of medium-sized, bright red, tart fruit early in the season. Ideal for pies.	Self-pollinating
English Morello Cherry	Sour Cherry (Pie Cherry)	A semi-dwarf, late-ripening sour cherry with dark red, highly acidic fruit. Excellent for cooking and processing.	Self-pollinating
Kansas Sweet Cherry	Cherry	A semi-dwarf sweet cherry variety selected for its hardiness and reliable performance in the Midwest, yielding sweet, dark red fruit.	Needs a cross-pollinator
Lapins Cherry	Cherry	A semi-dwarf, self-fertile sweet cherry that produces large, dark red, crack-resistant fruit with excellent flavor. A good choice for home orchards.	Self-pollinating
Montmorency Cherry	Sour Cherry (Pie Cherry)	A semi-dwarf, most popular sour cherry in North America. Produces bright red, tart fruit perfect for baking, preserves, and juice.	Self-pollinating
North Star Cherry	Sour Cherry (Pie Cherry)	A genetic dwarf sour cherry that stays small (8-10 ft) and produces dark red, tart fruit suitable for pies and preserves. Highly cold-hardy.	Self-pollinating
Rainier Cherry	Cherry	A semi-dwarf, gourmet sweet cherry known for its large size and golden-yellow skin with a red blush. Very sweet and low-acid.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Bing, Van)
Stella Cherry	Cherry	A semi-dwarf, self-fertile sweet cherry that produces dark red, heart-shaped, juicy, and very sweet fruit. A reliable producer.	Self-pollinating
Cherry Pie Cherry	Sour Cherry (Pie Cherry)	A semi-dwarf sour cherry selected for reliable, pie-quality fruit — bright red, tart, and juicy, ripening in early summer.	Self-pollinating

Dolgo Crabapple	Crabapple	A highly ornamental and functional crabapple tree, prized for its abundant, small, crimson-red fruit, which is excellent for making tart, clear jelly.	Self-pollinating and an excellent pollinator
Brown Turkey Fig	Fig	A very common and hardy fig, known for producing two crops of medium-sized, sweet, reddish-brown to purple figs with a mild flavor.	Self-pollinating
Celeste Fig	Fig	Often called the “Sugar Fig,” it’s a cold-hardy variety producing small to medium, sweet, rich, violet-brown figs with excellent flavor.	Self-pollinating
Chicago Hardy Fig	Fig	One of the most cold-tolerant fig varieties, capable of growing back from the roots after a hard freeze. Produces medium-sized, sweet, brown figs.	Self-pollinating
Paw Paw	Paw Paw	A native understory tree producing large, custard-like fruit with a tropical banana-mango flavor. Thrives in partial shade with rich, moist soil.	Needs a cross-pollinator (plant two different varieties or seedlings)

Bartlett Pear	Pear	A semi-dwarf, most popular European pear. Produces classic, bell-shaped, buttery, sweet, and juicy fruit perfect for fresh eating and canning.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Moonglow, Comice)
Comice Pear	Pear	A semi-dwarf, gourmet dessert pear known for its exceptional, sweet, creamy, and succulent flesh. Often eaten fresh.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Bartlett)

Native Persimmon	Persimmon	A standard-sized native American persimmon producing small, sweet fruit that's astringent until fully ripe; cold-hardy and low-maintenance.	Needs a pollinator (dioecious — plant both male and female trees for fruit)
Tam-O-Pan Persimmon	Persimmon	A standard-sized Asian persimmon producing very large, flattened, orange fruit with sweet, mild flavor when fully ripe.	Self-pollinating (Parthenocarpic)
Au Producer Plum	Plum	A semi-dwarf plum bred for the South, producing medium to large, red-skinned, yellow-fleshed fruit that is very productive and disease-resistant.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Methley, Santa Rosa)
Au Rosa Plum	Plum	A semi-dwarf plum, a cross between 'Methley' and 'Santa Rosa', producing large, red fruit with firm, sweet, yellow-amber flesh.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Methley, Santa Rosa)
Ozark Premier Plum	Plum	A semi-dwarf Japanese plum bred for the South, producing large, red-skinned, yellow-fleshed fruit that's juicy and flavorful.	Needs a cross-pollinator (e.g., Methley, Santa Rosa)
