Along with thousands of other families at our Sharing Thanksgiving event, she was there to pick up a holiday food box, which would help her create and share a meal with her family —a tradition they look forward to every year.

Amanda's story is woven by faith and love for the people in her life. As a mom, wife, and recovering addict who has been sober for 16 years, her resilience, generosity, and gratitude were on full display as we spoke. "I'm grateful for my family. God brought me through so much and blessed me with a wonderful child; I'm most thankful for him."



She emphasized how a Thanksgiving meal is more than filling your plate. "[I love] family getting together because we don't do that enough. When it comes to holidays, we make sure we get together."

Amanda has been supported by God's Pantry Food Bank and our partner, Fed by Grace Food Pantry, intermittently for a little more than five years. A disability has prevented her from doing the work she loves, but still, she strives to provide food for her family and neighbors; she raises chickens for eggs and utilizes the pantry to help when low on funds. "Bills and the price of food have gone up so much," she said. "It's a very bad feeling when you have to wonder if you're going to buy your dinner or pay your bill. I wish that on no one."

Thankfully, Amanda knows "the pantry is always there if you need them." We are so grateful for the many contributions that make this possible. Like Amanda, we hope your Thanksgiving is nourished and blessed with a table surrounded by those you hold dear. •

In the hills of Perry County, Kentucky, Teddy Day wakes up before dawn, pushing through pain to provide for his daughters. He works full-time, but still struggles to put food on the table. Some days, he skips meals so his kids don't have to.

Teddy's story is not unique.

Across Central and Eastern Kentucky, **nearly 280,000 people** face hunger—the highest number ever recorded. In some rural counties, **1 in 3 children** are food insecure. The **meal gap has surged to 53 million** meals annually, and families like Teddy's are feeling the strain every single day.

This is not just a crisis. It's a call to action.

That's why God's Pantry Food Bank launched the \$40 million "Building the Future, Nourishing Communities" capacity campaign—not just to build infrastructure, but to deliver more food, more often, to more people. The campaign strengthens our ability to support partners like New Hope Hazard
