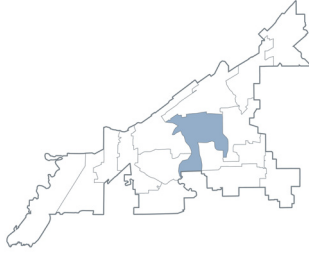

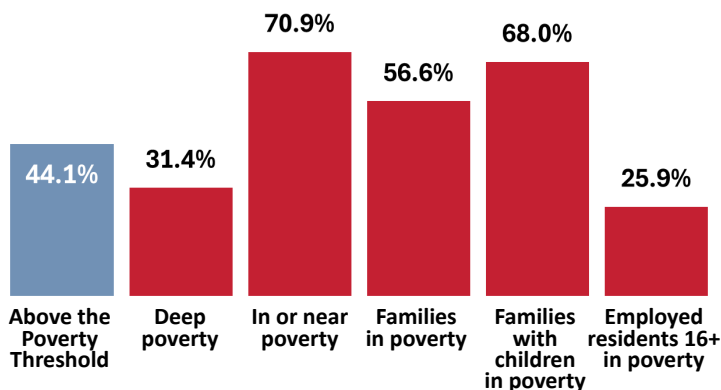

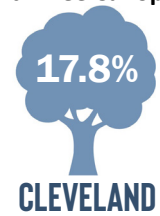
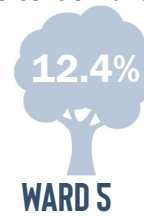

- ✓ Offering social, educational, & aesthetic benefits

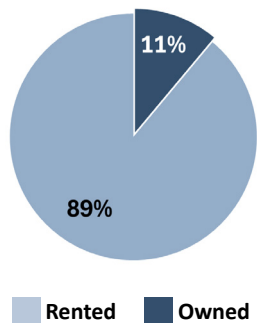

Neighborhood, Built Environment, and Housing

HOUSING AFFORDABILITY

About 1 in 10 houses in Ward 5 are owned, and 9 in 10 houses are rented. Of those occupied by homeowners, about 72.7% live in housing that is affordable to them, meaning their housing costs do not exceed 30% of the household income, compared to 57.5% of renters who live in affordable housing.

Housing composition in Ward 5



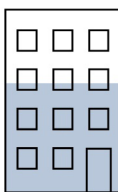

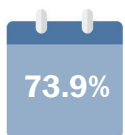
ESTIMATED AVERAGE LIFE EXPECTANCY OF RESIDENTS

This estimate is a measure of how long a baby born in 2019 is, on average, expected to live and is derived from population and death data from the National Center for Health Statistics.

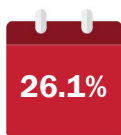

POOR MENTAL HEALTH STATUS IN THE LAST MONTH

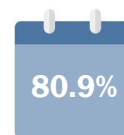

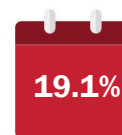
