The exhibition Visibilized Identities: Photographs and Videos from Private Collections presents works by forty-eight photographers and multidisciplinary artists who address various issues faced by individuals and groups who, due to their ethnic origin, gender, or coveral orientation, have been marginalized by society. The colocted works address


various themes affecting women, Indigenous people, Afro-descendants, and members of LGBT+ communities who have fought for their rights in predominantly racist and sexist societies in Latin America during the second half of the 20th century and the first decades of the 21st century.

The works on display explore themes related to identity, document the stories of different groups, question dominant narratives, and positions, and highlight social issues such as the injustices and inequalities to which so-called "minority" groups have been subjected. Individually, each work presents a valuable critical testimony from a personal perspective. The exhibition constitutes a valuable contribution to the documentation of the unofficial histories that have long existed in Latin America.


