


How are the regions of South-West England and the Pyrenees similar and different?

Vocabulary	
atlas	A collection of maps from around the world.
climate	The usual or average weather conditions over a long period of time.
coastline	The place where the land meets the ocean.
continent	A large area of land divided into countries.
county	A small area of the UK, containing lots of towns and villages.
features	Something that a place has, such as trees, a river, or hills.
landscape	A large area of land, where natural features can be seen.
mountain	Very high land, often with snow at the summit.
mountain range	Lots of mountains, connected in lines by high land.
region	A large area of a country or continent.
rural	A quiet, countryside area where very few people live and work.
summit	The highest point of a mountain.
urban	A busy area where many people live and work.

- Mountains are formed by the long-term movement of tectonic plates.
