

Destination Florida is a charity that takes children with life limiting or chronic medical conditions away for a 7-night trip of a life time, taking in some of the biggest theme parks and attractions in the world.

A highly trained team of medical, nursing, physiotherapy and non-medical helpers accompany the children on the trip to give them a truly life-changing experience.

We want to take the most deserving children and young people who will truly get the most out of the experience.

Please consider the following guidance which may assist you in nominating a child for the trip:

- Children must be aged between 7 and 16 years at the time of the trip.
- The children must live in the North of England as this allows for the home visit as well as ease of travel to the meeting prior to the trip.
- Children can be nominated by anyone, but they will require a medical assessment from their consultant or GP as to whether they will be fit to travel to the US prior to the trip.
- Children who are nominated should not have been on a previous holiday to Florida.
- Children who have had a previous “wish” granted by the Make a Wish Foundation or who have been on a similar trip with another charity are not eligible to apply.
- The children are not accompanied by their parents; therefore, they must be able to cope with time away from their families.
- The children should be developmentally able to appreciate the trip. Children with significant developmental delay may not significantly benefit from the experience.
- The parks visited are busy and unfamiliar environments. Children with severe autistic spectrum disorders may not cope well with this and are unlikely to be eligible for the trip.
- We ask that children with severe behavioural problems are not nominated due to the risk of disruptive and challenging behaviours which can adversely affect others.
- We cannot take children who require haemodialysis.
- We cannot take children who are ventilator dependent 24 hours a day.

All nominations of children for the Destination Florida trip must have the consent of the parent or guardian. A nomination does not guarantee the selection of the child for the trip, so it is strongly advised that the child is not informed of the nomination.

When nominating a child, please fill out the electronic form as fully as possible and ensure that contact details are accurate. This allows for the best chance for the child to be selected.

Destination Florida reserves the right to withdraw any nomination if the information is found to be deliberately false.

All children who are selected for the trip in the initial shortlisting process will receive a home visit from their group leader and lead nurse. This face-to-face assessment allows for an accurate appraisal of their suitability for the trip.
