#### **Opinion**

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of Friends of the Ethiopian Diaspora Trust Fund, Inc. ("EDTF", a nonprofit organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of **December 31, 2024**, and the related statements of activities, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In my opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of EDTF, Inc. as of **December 31, 2024**, and the changes in its net assets, and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statement

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or to error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about EDTF's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

My objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes my opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists.

The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, I:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about EDTF's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

#### **Notes to the Financial Statements**

#### Year Ended December 31, 2024

#### Note 1 - Organization:

Friends of EDTF, Inc. is a nonprofit organization incorporated in the state of Delaware that provides financial assistance to a handful of Charities that specialize in healthcare and education in Ethiopia.

The Organization is a nonprofit organization as described in Section 50l(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is exempt from federal income taxes.

#### Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of presentation - Financial statement presentation follows the U.S. generally accepted accounting principles promulgated by the Financial Accounting Standards Board. Under these principles, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.

Cash - All cash and highly liquid financial instruments with original maturities of three months or less, which are neither held for nor restricted by donors for long-term purposes, are considered to be cash and cash equivalents.

Fair Value Measurements - Fair value is defined as the price received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants. Accounting standards establish a hierarchy for measuring fair value that gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

Level 1 Unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets, or other inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 Inputs that are not observable that reflect management's assumptions and estimates.

Fair value measurements apply to the Organization's investments, all of which are classified within level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

## **Notes to the Financial Statements**

#### Year Ended December 31, 2024

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*Net assets*- Net assets, revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor or granter-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets and changes therein are comprised of:

<u>Net Assets Without Donor Restrictions</u> - There are no external donor stipulations that prohibit the Organization from utilizing these funds for general operations. As such, all of the net assets are shown as "non-restricted." Net assets available for use in both general operations and to support its mission without restrictions are \$ 5,707,746 as at December 31, 2024.

Revenue and revenue recognition - Revenue is recognized when earned. Contributions are recognized when cash, securities or other assets, an unconditional promise to give, or notification of a beneficial interest is received.

Conditional promises to give are not recognized until the conditions on which they depend have been substantially met.

Advertising costs - Advertising costs are expensed as incurred.

Income taxes – Friends of EDTF, Inc. is organized as a nonprofit corporation and has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as being exempt from federal income taxes under IRC section 501(a), as an organization described in IRC Section 501(c)3. The organization is required to file a Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax (Form 990) with the IRS. In addition, the organization is subject to income tax on net income that is derived from business activities that are unrelated to their exempt purpose. As of June 30, 2025, the Organization had not identified any uncertain tax positions under ASC Topic 740, Income Taxes, requiring adjustments to its financial statements. Generally, tax years ending December 31, 2022 through December 31, 2024 are open to examination by the federal taxing authorities. There are no income tax examinations currently in process.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

*Subsequent events* - Subsequent events were evaluated through June 30, 2025, which is the date the financial statement was available to be issued.
