# The food pyramid just flipped — and dairy demand is surging

**With raw milk and whole-fat dairy on the rise, top herdshares are scaling fast.**



For the first time in decades, federal dietary guidelines have flipped the food pyramid — placing whole foods, protein, and full-fat dairy back at the top.

The administration has called it the most significant reset in U.S. nutrition policy in history, ending the long-standing push away from saturated fats and refocusing Americans on real, minimally processed food.

Whether or not consumers follow dietary policy closely, these shifts matter — because they influence:

- School meal programs
- Federal food assistance
- Healthcare recommendations
- Media narratives
- Grocery buying behavior

And when national narratives change, consumer demand follows.

We've seen this cycle before:

- Organic
- Grass-fed
- Cage-free
- Non-GMO
- Local food
- Regenerative agriculture

Each movement started with policy, research, or media attention — and quickly translated into new buyer behavior.

This shift toward whole dairy and real food is no different.



## What we're already seeing

Across the country, dairies are reporting:

- Faster herdshare signups
- Growing waitlists
- Increased interest in full-fat and raw dairy
- More inbound questions from families looking for local food they trust

For many farms, this interest is arriving earlier in the season — and at higher volume — than in past years.

That's a good problem to have.

But it's also where systems get tested.

## Growth moments break farms first — not production

When demand spikes, most farms don't struggle because they can't produce enough milk.

They struggle because:

- Admin multiplies overnight
- Inboxes fill up
- Bottles go missing
- Payments get messy
- Pickup communication becomes reactive
- Agreements and compliance get harder to track

Growth exposes weak systems.

And the busiest farms aren't overwhelmed because demand is too high —they're overwhelmed because infrastructure didn't keep up.

# This is a readiness moment for dairies

Policy shifts like this don't happen often.

When they do, they create new buying behavior – fast.

The farms that benefit most are the ones that:

- Can scale cleanly
- Onboard members smoothly
- Communicate clearly
- Track money and containers automatically
- Stay compliant without paper chaos

In short: farms with systems built for growth.

# Member Growth Controls

# Onboarding & Agreements

# Marketing & Clarity

Money and containers multiply fast.

- Members automatically receive pickup or delivery notifications by text/email
- Pickup or delivery changes don't require individual messages
- You can message specific locations, routes, or member groups instantly
- Logistics aren't communicated through social posts or group texts
- Missed pickups or failed deliveries are handled cleanly
- You can see fulfillment status in real time
